## **MEMBERSHIP AND DUES RENEWAL**

The Orientation and Safety Program for new members takes place on the last Saturday of the month throughout 2004, with the exception of December 2004 when it will be on the third Saturday due to Xmas holiday. The Orientation takes place at the Club House commencing at 10:00 AM sharp and usually adjourns about 12:30. Prospective members will learn firearms safety, proper handling of firearms, range commands, the dos and don't of shooting on the ranges, restrictions and use of the various ranges seven days a week from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm (assuming daylight) management and operation of the club and standing rules of the ranges (range safety rules). Upon completion of the Orientation a test will be given and if the test is passed, the person can decide if he or she wishes to become a member and can pay their dues, \$70.00, initiation fee \$80.00 and join the NRA. Each will be issued an electronic gate key (\$10.00 deposit) and can use the ranges that same afternoon. Dues are valid for twelve consecutive months and upon the next due date the member will receive a mail reminder that their dues must be paid by the end of the month of their anniversary date. If not paid the member is given a 30-day grace period in which to pay their dues. If the 30 days pass without payment the member's electronic key card is canceled. To become a member after that, the initiation fee along with dues must be paid plus redo the Orientation and test. Upon payment of dues there is no receipt given or new membership card issued. It all runs off the electronic key card for the gate, if your key card is working properly that tells you that your dues are paid up for the period in question. Each year members are assessed for eight hours work at \$10.00 an hour for \$80.00. This policy commenced in September of 2003, so that between your first payment of dues after that date and your renewal date, you have these 12 months in which to fulfill this obligation. This is done so that out of the 552 members we have an opportunity to get participation from everyone, not just the 75 or 80 members that are the volunteers for all of the projects, including Director's duties and Officers responsibilities. As noted in the Plinker you can satisfy this obligation, by bringing in two new members (at \$40.00 each), working eight hours at \$10.00 an hour or working a few hours and paying the balance of the assessment. You will all receive a card on which you can list your volunteer work and have the responsible person initial the card verifying the work. If you have a question you can call the club number, 956-0608 and leave a message and the club will get you an answer quickly and phone you back. The membership is a family membership, so that your spouse, sons and daughters can also participate in the club activities and shoots. The member must accompany family members to the ranges or guests invited out on occasion. Remember you are legally responsible for your actions and those of your family and guests. So keep your dues paid timely and volunteer for activities and clean-up and enjoy your club.

## **.22 RIMFIRE BENCHREST**

The new season for .22 benchrest shooters arrives on Saturday, February 7th! There will be one match on the first Saturday of each month through September. (Note how this cleverly leaves the entire winter hunting season open). For those returning shooters, the start of the season is an event - - time to show off new equipment, see old friends, and swap information. New shooters will also show up and will be welcomed, assisted with the procedures, rules and peculiarities of benchrest shooting. Usually, after attending a few matches, a new benchrest shooter will be heard to say "I can't believe how much I have learned and how much it has helped me in other shooting events." The first match is very relaxed - no one gets too excited about scores, we just work out some of the kinks from over the winter, try out new ammo etc. so it is an excellent time for a first time benchrester to bring out his best .22 and join in the fun. Don't worry about the different rifle classes or rules - just show up and you'll be fit in and assisted with the program. It's a new year so join us for an interesting season on the Smallbore (old Pistol) range.

***Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003***

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. (All Life memberships are required to pay the \$15/member annual insurance fee.)

**(GUESTS:** Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old as guests as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

## Minutes

### Flag Salute

Attendance - All Directors were present except: Dave Akehurst, Mike Nelson and Greg Squires who was ill.

Traction at the Gate - Jim Dotterer described his work spreading chicken grit at the gate to improve vehicle traction in the snow and suggested that a barrel of grit be placed there for future use.

Treasurer's Report - Tom Holladay reported account balances as follows: Money Market \$6,018.28; Capital Projects Fund - 3 members paid their \$80 assessments bringing the fund to \$2,384; Emergency Fund \$1,134 and Homestreet Bank \$82,553.02. He also reported: all bills are paid that we received; all accounts will be balanced by the February meeting to be turned over to a CPA for calculating taxes and the Board of Directors for budget records; seventeen members did not pay their dues in November and are no longer members; fifteen members are in inactive status for failing to pay their dues in December and will be terminated as of January 31, 2004. The Secretary needs to write letters to financial institutions notifying them of the election of new officers.

Membership Report - Rich Montecucco reported that membership, subtracting the seventeen members who dropped out in November, is 535. For those who had asked, he reported that CCRP currently has 28 life members.

Club Demographics - Jim D. spoke briefly about the fact that many members are in their 50's or older. He suggested that we need to encourage younger people to join the club and cited this as the justification for CCRP hosting more "fun" events.

Forestry Study - Jim reported that Bill Vogel had indicated his willingness to help out with our forestry study. Bill works in the industry and should be a big help to CCRP.

Budget Input - John Cadoo reported that most directors had turned in their budget input, but he was still waiting to hear from a few others.

Standing Rules - John Cadoo summarized the proposed changes to the standing rules as follows: add an "introduction" page; require each range director to establish safety rules and post them at his/her range including a specification of what firearms may or may not be fired on the range; adding the event application process, already developed, to the Standing Rules and requiring that Match directors have first aid kits available at their events and recommending that they have cell phones. He reported that more work is needed, still, on the director job descriptions, no a part of the Standing Rules. Will Ulry noted that there is never a shortage of cell phones at any event that he has attended, but he feels that CCRP should have earplugs and safety glasses for sale to those who lack this safety equipment. Jim D. proposed that each range director post a procedure, including specific directions for reaching her/his range, for reporting accident or injury. Levi Bussanich suggested that GPS coordinates be included in the directions for better guidance should a Med-Evac helicopter be required. Darlene Langa asked if the Littlerock FD actually know how to get into our property. Will Ulry indicated his certainty that the Littlerock Fire Department knows how to get to our ranges. Darrell Gehlsen suggested that directional signs for all ranges be installed.

Proxy Voting - Under the By-Laws currently in force (the old ones) a significant number of members must either vote in person at the February meeting on the new By-Laws or submit a proxy vote in order for the total vote to be valid. Because typical meeting attendance is so low, Shirley Rheault suggested that members of the Board of Directors phone club members asking them to either attend the February meeting or submit their proxy ballot as contained in the January "Plinker" (the February "Plinker" will also have a proxy ballot). Various alternative approaches were discussed, but most of the Board of Directors signed up to contact a dozen members each to urge them to vote or submit their proxy ballot.

Range Safety Officers - Will Ulry provided a roster of RSO's. At present there are only 16 RSO's affiliated with the club. Jim D. expressed disappointment that we had so few RSO's. Jerry Rheault suggested that Jim contact the NRA for the names of any RSO in Western Washington. Jim pointed out that sometimes an RSO may have personal commitments that prevent her/him from officiating at a match. Discussion ensued as to whether RSO's needed to be cross-trained in multiple disciplines (for example an RSO with experience in pistol matches to learn about being an RSO for high power matches). Bob Gietz suggested that each range provide it's own RSO backup. Jim Zobrist questioned whether someone would be willing to spend \$35 and one and one-half days (the RSO course tuition and duration) to become an RSO. Considerable discussion followed as to means for increasing the number of RSO. No conclusion was reached and Jim promised to put this issue on the February meeting agenda.

Big Buck Contest - Will Ulry announced the contest and potluck will start at 6:00pm Wednesday January 14.

Project Management - Ray Crisp outlined the need to develop criteria for initiating CCRP projects. He pointed out the vital importance of determining funding before undertaking a project. He needs guidelines and he will contact range directors to determine their "wish lists." Shirley R. pointed out that she has a list of members who have indicated a

willingness to contribute their talents for specific types of work.

Civic Projects - Darlene Langa briefly outlined some of the specific activities (for example picture taking, preparing write-ups, etc) that she will employ to foster better public knowledge of CCRP events and activities. She also suggested that CCRP offer Larry Burkett who teaches the Olympia Police Department handgun courses to also teach on CCRP premises. Darlene was concerned over whether our insurance coverage would apply. Jerry R. said it would and read a portion of a letter from our insurance carrier outlining just what coverage would apply.

Shotgun Rules - Bob Gietz outlined a set of rules that, if passed, would allow the use of shotguns, with specific limitations, on the Black Powder, Multi-Purpose and High Power ranges. A motion to enact the rules was made, seconded and passed. The rules are as follows:

"With the consent of the Range Director and when these conditions are posted on the particular range, shotguns may be used to engage aerial targets (clay pigeons). This rule will permit some casual, hand-thrown, shooting in the interests of providing reasonable accommodation for member interest. The following conditions apply:

1. Shotgun shooting shall be the only shooting activity conducted at that time.
2. Shot size shall be no larger (numerically smaller) than #7 1/2.
3. Shooter shall be no than more 5 yards in front of the established firing line on the range (front of range shelter).
4. Direction of fire shall be parallel to the long axis of the range; lateral limits are the range width at the extreme end of the range.
5. All shell debris shall be removed from the range. Unbroken targets shall also be retrieved.
6. Shotgun shooting is a secondary activity. Other shooting shall have priority for range use."

Budget - There will be no general Board of Directors meeting in March. The Executive Committee will meet to resolve the budget. Directors, other than the Executive Committee, may be present, but action will be limited to the Executive Committee.

Plinker - Publication of the Plinker is costly. Costs exceed \$5,000 per year. Several alternatives such as publication every other month and moving the Plinker to a club web site were discussed. Jerry R. mentioned that alternate month publication had already been tried unsuccessfully. Ray Crisp and Darrell Gehlsen provided estimates of the costs of operating a web site. Shirley R. indicated that the club might contact those individuals who have volunteered to be Web Masters. No decision was reached.

Scheduling - Chris Moffet is working on the monthly schedules. He has lots of questions about "carry over" items. Match Directors need to contact Chris. He also is scheduling work parties. He needs to find people who are willing to move their matches to accommodate work parties.

Adjournment - The meeting adjourned at 8:40 P.M.
