# **Cowboy Action Comes to CCR&P**

45 shooters from as far away as British Columbia joined the Black River Regulators for CCR&P's first ever Cowboy Action match on Saturday, June 26. The weather was great and the match was fun. CCR&P's well-kept grounds and the clean shooting bays impressed many people. One shooter said that he thought we had the "most beautiful gun club in the northwest." If you are a Wild West history buff, or a fan of the B westerns, this new shooting sport may be for you. Participants dress in costume, adopt an alias and shoot a series of shooting problems or "stages" using single action pistols, lever action rifles (in pistol calibers), and double barrel or Winchester '97 shotguns. There are several shooting categories including special ones for ladies and junior shooters to help encourage family participation.

The shooter with the fastest time wins, but the real goal is to have as much fun as possible. There will be a series of targets to shoot in a specific order with each firearm. The targets are usually big and close but many shooters figure out how to miss them anyway. Missing a target, or messing up the sequence will cost the shooter a time penalty.


Shooting problems or "stages" will often have western themes and sometimes the shooter has a line to say before the clock starts – perhaps a quote from a western movie. There may be non-shooting tasks to perform – like tossing a stick of "dynamite". Movement between shooting positions is often required.

We will be holding Cowboy Action Shooting matches on the fourth Saturday of each month on the Action Pistol Range. The mandatory shooter's safety meeting is at 9:30 AM and match fees are \$10.00 (\$7.00 for juniors).

If you have never participated in a Cowboy Action Shooting match before, we require that you complete Cowboy Shooting Orientation before shooting your first match. Cowboy Orientation will be offered on the Sunday following each match, starting at 9 AM on the Action Pistol Range. We will cover safety procedures, rules of the game, firearm restrictions and costume requirements.

Cowboy Orientation is free and you are welcome to take the course as many times as you like. For information about Cowboy Orientation and what you need to bring, call Vicki Steigner at (360) 754-4328.

### MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. (All Life memberships are required to pay the \$15/member annual insurance fee.)

(<u>GUESTS</u>: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

# **Minutes**

Capitol City Rifle & Pistol Club Board of Directors Meeting July 9, 2004

Meeting began at 7:03 P.M.

Flag Salute Jeff Young led the flag salute.

Attendance - Jim Dotterer called the roll. All Directors were present except: Dave Akehurst, Ray Crisp, Mike Iyall, Chris Moffet, Mike Nelson, Jerry Rheault, Shirley Rheault, Greg Squires and Will Ulry.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Tom Holladay reported the following account balances: checking account - \$2,267.93; Heritage money market - \$536.26; Heritage Capital Funds - \$2,831.33; Heritage Emergency - \$732.38 and Homestreet Long Term Investment - \$82,851.76. <u>Membership Report</u> - Rich Montecucco reported that as of July CCRP has 411 members. Jim Dotterer commented that his budget estimates were based on a membership of 400 members.

<u>New Director Elected</u> - At the last meeting, Jim D. indicated that another co-director for the Action Pistol Range was needed to assist Ron Morton and proposed that Bill Wright be elected to the position. Bill spoke briefly about his background as a director of the Tri-County gun club in Oregon and his experience with cowboy action shooting. It was moved, seconded and passed that Bill be made co-director of the Action Pistol Range.

<u>Website/Reducing Plinker Costs</u> – Jim D. commented briefly on the annual savings possible by reducing Plinker publication and mailing costs. He said that switching from hardcopy to Web publication of the Plinker will begin with new members who will be offered Web publication as an option.

<u>CCRP at Thurston County Fair</u> – Jim D. reported that he had acquired 2,000 cable gun locks for distribution at the fair, noted Will Ulry's e-mail to directors and reminded directors that a planning meeting for the fair booth will take place at 7:00 PM Thursday, July 15 at the Clubhouse.

<u>Hunter Sight-In</u> – Jim D. reported that Ray Crisp is contacting members to help set up for Hunter Sight In on the last weekend in September and the first weekend in October (September 25, 26 and October 2,3).

New Combinations – Jim D. said that John Crossman will contact Darrell Gehlsen with the names of high school coaches and others who will need the new combinations.

Noise Abatement – Jim D. pointed out that right now Thurston County is concerned about potential motor vehicle (i.e. race car) noise. However, he proposed that CCRP join with Evergreen Gun Club to present a united front should the Thurston County Commissioners revisit a noise ordinance affecting gun clubs. Jim also noted Bill Wright's prior experience in noise abatement at Tri-County Gun Club in Oregon. Both Jim and Bill spoke briefly on inexpensive techniques for noise abatement including extending a lattice from the roof-line of shooting sheds and hanging carpet squares under the roof. No action was taken, however.

<u>Upcoming Work Days</u> – Jim D. reported that no one has contacted him to join the work party scheduled for July 31st and August 1st. <u>Protecting Against Lead Pollution and Ricochets</u> – Directors viewed a video provided by Ron Morton concerning protecting indoor ranges against lead pollution and ricochets.

<u>Clubhouse Safes</u> – Jim D. gave directors a guided tour of the club's various safes and secured storage. Darrell Gehlsen announced that combinations and/or locks will all be changed about August 1st.

<u>Purchase 60 Inch Television</u> – Darrell Gehlsen offered to sell the 60" TV installed in the meeting room to the club for \$150. It was moved, seconded and passed that the club pay Darrell \$150 for the set.

<u>Long Term Planning</u> – Various ways of making incremental upgrades to the clubhouse roof were discussed, but no conclusions reached. Bob Jamison indicated that he will be pressure washing the roof and will report to directors on its condition at the next meeting.

<u>Disabled Members</u> – Rich M. asked how physically handicapped members can fill out their work hours. Several directors suggested various clerical tasks as possible ways of meeting the work hour requirement, but no conclusions were reached. <u>Adjournment</u> – The meeting adjourned at 8:15 PM.

# A Primer on Gun Permits and Carrying Weapons

Any person 21 years of age may apply for a concealed pistol license to the chief of police or the sheriff of the county. The license authorizes a person to carry a loaded pistol on his or her person. A person cannot carry a loaded pistol in a vehicle unless he or she has a license and (a) the pistol is on the licensee's person or (b) the licensee is within the vehicle at all times that the loaded pistol is located there, or (c) the licensee is away from the vehicle and the pistol is locked within the vehicle and concealed from view from the outside. No license is necessary to carry a loaded concealed pistol at a person's home or fixed place of business. Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 9.41.050.

A person under 18 years of age cannot possess a firearm unless he or she is (a) in attendance at a hunter's safety course or a firearms safety course or (b) engaging in the practice in the use of a firearm or target shooting at a range authorized by the county or city in an area where the discharge of a firearm is not prohibited or (c) engaging in an organized competition involving the use of a firearm, by an organized group that uses firearms as part of its performance or (d) hunting or trapping under a valid license issued to the person or (e) in an area where the discharge of a firearm is permitted, is not trespassing, and the person is either at least 14 years old, has been issued a hunter safety certificate, and is using a lawful firearm other than a pistol or is under the supervision of a parent, guardian, or other adult approved by the parent or guardian or (f) traveling with any unladed firearm in the person's possession to or from any of these activities or (g) on real property under the control of his or her parent, relative or legal guardian and who has the permission of the parent or guardian to possess a firearm or (h) is at his or her residence and who with the permission of his or her parent or legal guardian, possesses a firearm for the purpose of exercising the right of self defense. RCW 9.41.042

The license is only valid in the state of Washington. Based upon reciprocity, Idaho and Montana honor the license, but Oregon and California do not. It is a federal felony to sell a firearm to a non-resident of this state. State law prohibits the carrying of loaded rifles or shotguns in a vehicle. Many premises are off limits to carrying a pistol even with a license, including common school grounds, courthouses, bars, cocktail lounges, and federal facilities.
