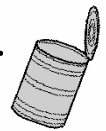

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. (All Life memberships are required to pay the \$15/member annual insurance fee.)

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

Minutes

Flag Salute

Attendance - Jim Dotterer called the roll. All directors were present except Ray Crisp (excused), Jerry Rheault and Jeff Young.

Treasurer's Report - Tom Holladay reported the following account balances: checking - \$3,379.62; money market - \$537.87; capital projects, with \$1,240 added for March, \$3,011.40; emergency fund, with \$795 added for March, \$1,583.80 and the Homestreet account - \$84,009.51.

Membership - Rich Montecucco reported total membership is 400.

Web Site Online - Jim D. reminded directors that they, as well as all CCRP members, should sign up for the on-line Plinker. All it takes is to visit CCRPclub.com and click on the appropriate spot. Several directors noted that CCRP's web site is easy to use and very attractive. Darrell Gehlsen pointed out that if all members opted for the on-line Plinker, CCRP would save virtually enough money to repair the clubhouse roof.

Standing Rules - Shirley Rheault and John Cadoo presented three sections of the revised Standing Rules (SR): the Event Application, the club officer job descriptions and the Release and Assumption of Risk Agreement (Hold Harmless Agreement). Following considerable discussion, changes as follows were adopted: to the Event Application included 1) revision of the "renewal" paragraph and 2) a requirement that the Secretary work with Match Directors to redesign the Monthly Activity Report; to the club officer job descriptions section, deletion of the portion of the first paragraph that listed the job descriptions, deletion of line number 9 d) from the Treasurer's job description and revisions to the job descriptions for the Directors of Security and Work Scheduling. Will Ulry moved that these sections, as modified, be accepted. The motion was seconded and passed.

CCRP / CCB Agreement - Jim D. pointed out that Ray Crisp would be available later in the month and that, because of IRS requirements, the agreement would probably result in a lease between CCRP and CCB.

Budgeting - Jim D. listed the various repairs needed to preserve the club house including roofing, siding, cleaning, painting and disposal of old shingles. However, he said that funds for these and other repairs (e.g. road repair) require that Match Directors and others with income sources provide him with their budget figures for 2005. He asked that 1) budgets be e-mailed to him by April 23rd using the form previously distributed and 2) that budgets include three categories: "need to do", "want to do" and "nice to do" items.

Gun Show Booths - Rich M. solicited volunteers to staff a CCRP booth at upcoming gun shows. Jim D. said that he would participate.

Road Repair - Bob Gietz spoke concerning the critical timing for road repair. He pointed out the CCRP has been lucky in that there has been relatively little rain this season. However, if we are to repair the entrance road he said, it must be accomplished in the August/September time period.

Adjournment - The meeting adjourned at 8:33 PM
