BOY SCOUTS SPRING HUNT

Boys and adults from 4 scout Troops in the area gathered at CCRP on a rainy Saturday April 8th for a minirendezvous learning and practicing skills essential to the Mountain Men of the Fur Trade Era. Julie Walker of Troop 373 from Chehalis had acted as inspiration and point of contact for the Scouting community. Three events were set up for participation by groups of scouts and adults Crew for Friday set-up consisted of Will Ulry, Bob Gietz, Jim Robertson and Matt Gilham. The Black Powder range provided familiarization and competition with muzzle loading Hawken Replica Rifles. Steve Andrews was in charge with able assistance from J K Johnson, Jim Robertson, John Valdeff and Tim Sampson. Will Ulry setup and conducted a ten-station Tomahawk throw course assisted by Scott Chambers. The Capitol City Bowmen: Ray & Sherrie Crisp, Quentin Robbins, Ernie Rheault, Bob Jamison and Bailey the Dog provided an interesting and challenging archery segment. The Washington State Muzzleloaders Association through a grant provided resources for the shooting event and award medals. A total of 32 boys and adults were present for the competition. Eighteen participants had this as their first time rendezvous experience and received WSMA Pilgrim Medals. WSMA medals for top three scores in each event as well as overall combined aggregate were presented. All participants had an opportunity to select and additional award from the Aggregate blanket provided jointly by the Scout Troops and the Puget Sound Free Trappers. Many of the scouts commented that the instruction and opportunity to participate was a highlight of the event. Thankful appreciation is extended to the WSMA for the generous grant that made this event possible.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS</u>: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)


