MISSION STATEMENT

Annual bowling pin trophy match

On August 20th we have our annual bowling pin trophy match. Course consists of four matches (five including the Bloody Bob Blast). Each match will be 72 rounds in 12 stages with 6 rounds on 6 pins in each stage.

.32 Match: .32 ACP, .32 S&W, .32 S&W Long, .32 Short or Long Colt, .32 NP. Fixed sight and barrels no longer than 4 inches. No .22 rimfires, compensators, electronic or optical sights.

Single Action Match: Single action revolvers only.

Revolver Match: Revolvers only (single or double action).

Regular Match: Open to autoloaders or revolvers.

Shooters in the Regular Match only will be divided into four classes based upon handicap scores from previous matches. If you don't have a handicap and I can't fake one for you, you shoot in "A" class.

In the .32 match pins only have to be knocked down. In all other matches they have to be off the table.

Trophies will be awarded for the first three places in the .32, Single Action and Revolver matches. For the Regular match they will be awarded for the first three places in each class.

Shooting is supposed to start at 08:30 (It never does but it's a pleasant dream). There will also be hotdogs and hamburgers if I can find a cook. If not I'll do it myself and you'd be better off bringing a sack lunch.

Fees are \$10.00 for signup and \$5.00 per gun.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM Flag Salute: Ray Crisp led the flag salute

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

July 14, 2006

Attendance: All board members present except: Ron Morton Jim

Greeves. Members excused were Steve Andrews, Bob Gietz, Bill Wright & Bob Parr

Treasurer's Report: Darrell Gehlsen reported the following balances; Homestreet \$30,274.22, Certificates of Deposit \$80,930.90.00 and checking \$5,522.53. Darrell also reported that the club year to date net income is \$18,037.67. Jim D. made a motion to accept the treasurer's report, Larry L. seconded, motion passed.

Membership Report: Darrell reported that the club has approximately 420 members at the present time.

Old Business

Timber Mgt. Chris presented a document produced by Professional Forestry Services of Tumwater. The document outlines a proposed management plan and contract to manage the timber resources held by CCRP. Discussion followed concerning the "five year" logging limit, tax issues and potential profit for the club. It was suggested that the club do a background check on the principles of PFS prior to moving forward. Chris will get the necessary information and set a date for the Board members to meet with PFS.

Non-Profit Status: This issue is still not settled. Shirley proposed that we ask PFS if they can recommend a CPA firm that has experience with timber issues to help us determine how we want to address our tax status in the most advantageous way.

Holliday: The club has yet to recover our property. Jim reported that if the confiscated property Is auctioned off, the auction house will take 30% off the top. Bershauer is not interested in dealing with the property, they only want the money. Shirley R. made a motion that we go to Bershauer and offer to deal with dispensing of the property. Rick B. seconded, motion carried.

R100 Archery Shoot: Ray C. reported that CCRP should realize about \$750 from the Memorial Weekend match. He would like to hold the match again in 2007 on the 3rd weekend in May. Ray was instructed to submit an event form and get the ball rolling. We need to tie down the date early so the national sponsors can plan their west coast schedule.

Insurance: Darryl reported our new cost for building insurance is \$6,900.00. This is about \$2,000.00 less than what we were paying our previous carrier.

New Business

Long Range Planning: The only response so far is from the director of the Action Pistol Range. Their issues are removal of danger trees, handicapped access to restroom facilities, additional shooting bays, road work and upgraded parking area. In order to do comprehensive long range planning, all range directors and others that see needs must contribute their ideas to the Board.

Lead Abatement: Jim reported that the club needs to implement a lead abatement program. He submitted a task list of needed actions to take. The issue of mining the lead from impact areas was discussed. Will U. made a motion to accept Jim's proposal to form a committee and authorize a \$1,000 budget. Ray C. seconded the motion. Discussion followed, Ron L. questioned the need for a budget as did others. The motion was amended to drop the \$1,000 budget item. Motion carried. Ron L., Chris M., Noel V., Rick B., and Jerry R. have lead abatement notebooks for study.

Gun makers Guild: Bob Gietz left word that this group would be meeting at CCRP in August.

By-Laws: A question was raised concerning the clause that states that if CCRP loses its ability to operate, all assets of the club become the property of the NRA. Discussion followed as to why this clause is in the By-Laws. It was put in prior to the current management concept. The clause was a fail safe measure to insure that the club and its assets did not fall into the hands of the IRS or State/County entities. The NRA has never completed their part. This issue needs to be cleaned up and finalized.

Property Gate: Jim D. reported that property at the entrance, which was traded, surveyed and accepted by adjacent property owner was never recorded with the county. Jim wants to form a committee to check into what happened to the changes that should have been made several years ago. Jerry R. will work with Jim as he has some historical knowledge of the issue.

Mowers: Bob Greenman reported that the MTD rider has blown up. He has an opportunity to purchase a mower deck (not a brush hog) for our tractor for \$700.00. Shirley R. made a motion to approve purchase of the mower deck. Ray C. seconded. Motion carried. It was also noted that there is a rider mower in the Holliday property. We will pursue getting that mower as well to use in areas a big mower deck can't get into.

Women on Target: Shirley reported that CCRP hosted a shoot last weekend. The shoot was held so that a program could be filmed for showing on TCTV. The plan is to show the match on TCTV eight times during the month of September.

Nominating Committee: Shirley noted that it is time to begin looking for volunteers to serve on the Board beginning in January of 07. It's a great way to serve the club and it's members. If you are interested please contact one of the current board members and we will get your name to the proper

Building Roof: The issue of replacing the roof for the clubhouse came up as this is the season for that type of work to be done. The estimated cost is \$50,000.00. Larry L. questioned the value of spending that amount of money on a 70 year old building that doesn't appear to have many useful years left in it. Darryl noted that if we lose the building to a fire we have insurance to replace it. Bob will solicit quotes for a 35 year roof.

Small Bore: Mike Mobbs requested permission to hold his match this coming weekend. The match is now current with reports and payments. Ray C. made a motion to allow the match. Larry L. seconded. Motion carried.

Motion to Adjourn: Ray C. made a motion to adjourn at 9:05 PM. Shirley seconded. Motion carried.
