## BLACK POWDER COMING SOON

Black Powder Muzzle Loading monthly matches will resume on Sunday, October 15<sup>th</sup>. At the usual time (Shooting start at 1000) and accustomed location (The Black Powder Range, naturally). A few words of information for prospective new participants: Matches are shot in open relays with new shooters able to join the match in progress if there are situations delaying arrival. Each match includes events for Rifle and Pistol, and usually, Trade Gun. Match range fee is \$10.00. Targets include paper and reaction targets with flyers for the Trade Gunners. Prizes, provided from the Range Fees are given for the top three in each category Aggregate blanket prizes are awarded to those with the best combined scores of combined rifle and pistol. Suggested aggregate prize (approx. \$5 value) is something period related (or, typically a miniature Abraham Lincoln commemorative poster which looks very much like a \$5 bill). Aggregate scores are computed and posted in order but those contributing to the blanket are given the opportunity to recoup something for their efforts

The November match will be our traditional Turkey Shoot which will have blanket items (Turkey, Ham, Bacon) provided by the free Trappers.

Match Dates for the coming season are: October 15<sup>th</sup>, November 19<sup>th</sup>, December 17<sup>th</sup>, January 21<sup>st</sup>, April 15<sup>th</sup>, May 20<sup>th</sup> (No matches in February or March due to Rain Dee Voo and Spring Thaw events)

Each match will offer one or more additional luck targets. Traditional, 'period attire' is optional, will be recognized for bonus points for three clothing items and for moccasins or true period foot wear.

In preparation for Rain Dee Voo 2007, a brief Free Trappers meeting will be held at each shoot. Raffle tickets for the rifle are available. Spectators and new shooters are welcome. # MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Flag Salute: Chris Moffet lead the flag salute.

August 4, 2006

Attendance: Directors present: Rick Baldwin, Bob Gietz, Larry Lufkin, Chris Moffet, Shirley Rheault, Will Ulry. Directors excused: Ray Crisp, Jim Dotterer, Ron Lohman, Ron Morton, Doug Simpson, Greg Squires, Bill Wright, Noel Vaughn, and Bob Parr.

Guests: John Cadoo and Bob Jamison.

Note: The number of directors present was insufficient to form a quorum.

<u>Treasurer's report:</u> Treasurer was not present and no report was made.

Note: Larry Lufkin calculated that approximately 64% of the club income comes from club member dues and related fees. John Cadoo suggested a "demographics" analysis to create a picture of the club in various categories: i.e.: age groups, etc. Bob Gietz and Larry Lufkin agreed to check with Darrell Gelhsen for additional information and create a database to survey.

Membership Report: Membership director was not present and no report was made.

#### **Old Business**

<u>Forestry Report:</u> The requested background check was made and returned with excellent marks. Chris Moffet to complete the agreement with Professional Forestry Services and initiate the forestry management plan.

Non-profit Status and CPA: The Club is looking for a CPA with experience in "501c" entities to assist the Board with the Club's non-profit status.

<u>Clubhouse Roof:</u> Bob Jamison received 5 bids to re-roof the clubhouse. Bids ranged from \$23K to \$50K. Will Ulry had contacted another contractor and was to arrange for him to meet with Bob Jamison. Upon completion of that meeting, a special board meeting will be called to identify the best bid and vote to initiate the work.

<u>Club-wide Work Party:</u> Approximately 30 – 40 members showed up to work. Dave Nelson did 8 plus hours of work with his tractor to meet the terms of his agreement with the club in exchange for his next year's dues and assessment. He then offered to exchange 12 yards of gravel for 2 years of dues. This work was done and the board members present agreed that this was acceptable. Chris Moffet to write a formal letter to Dave Nelson informing him of this agreement.

Holliday: No report.

Gate Property: The search is still on for documents. No further info.

Long-range Planning: Nothing new brought up today.

#### **New Business**

<u>Historical Gunmaker's Guild:</u> The Guild wishes to hold another event in the clubhouse in January per Bob Gietz. The Guild to submit an event application for this.

<u>Club Flyer:</u> Bob Gietz submitted an updated club flyer. It looks great. Thank you, Bob. The directors present approved the use of the new flyer.

Important Club Documents: Suggestions were made to purchase a fire-proof safe for the mentioned documents and also to scan said documents onto CD to store at other locations.

Women On Target: Shirley Rheault handed out new WOT flyers and also noted they are available on the club's website.

<u>Puget Sound Freetrappers:</u> Will Ulry informed the board that the Puget Sound Freetrappers are considering sponsoring and holding the Blackpowder Shoot at the Oregon Trail Days in 2007.

Motion to Adjourn: Larry Lufkin made a motion to adjourn at 8:15 p.m. Shirley Rheault seconded. Motion carried.

Emergency Board Meeting August 17, 2006

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by Jim Dotterer

Members Present: J Dotterer, R. Montecucco, D. Simpson, B Gietz, L. Lufkin, R. Lohman & G. Squires. Excused w/proxy – C. Moffett, B. Wright, R. Morton & W. Ulry

Bob Jamison presented the bids that he had received for re-roofing the clubhouse. The bids ran from approximately \$52,000.00 to \$24,000.00. Bob recommended to the Board that we accept the \$23,872.00 bid from Rapid roofing for their 50 mil DuraLast roofing product.

Bob Gietz made a motion to accept the bid and Rich Montecucco seconded.

Larry Lufkin questioned the wisdom in spending approximately 1/3 of our assets on an 80 year old building, and also questioned the additional hidden cost to replace an unknown number of plywood sheets in the event that wet or dry rot is encountered in the reroofing process. He also asked where the money would come from to pay the cost of the project. It was noted that the money would come from Certificates of Deposit and other funds as needed.

The original motion was amended to add a \$33,000 cap on the cost and a vote was taken. The motion passed by a vote of 8 – 3. Larry, Ron and Greg voted against the project. The Board appointed Bob Jamison to be the liaison between the board and the contractor for the duration of the project. Ron Lohman questioned the legality of dumping the old roofing material on CCRP property. Mr. Jamison assured him that it was legal to dump and cover the old material.

Rich made a motion to adjourn, Doug seconded, motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 7:25 PM
