Beginner/Intermediate Centerfire Pistol Match

The temperature at the start of the beginner/intermediate match was 29 degrees and wasn't much warmer by the time we ended at 1 PM. Twenty shooters showed up though and braved this extreme cold.

The match, as has become the case, featured lots of diversity and difficulty. Bay two included 3, 7-yard stations, including one shot only with the weak hand, one with bowling pins, and one shot only with the strong hand. Bay three included 2, 25-yard stations. One station was shot sitting in a chair. The other was shot with only the weak hand. At each of the 5 stations, shooters needed to pay attention to the course of fire because the shooters had to shoot the targets in a specific order. If the order was not followed, the shooter lost all points for that station. An example of the course of fire was station 4 where shooters started with an unloaded pistol laying on a table along with 3 partially loaded magazines and 6 loose rounds. Shooters loaded their guns, shot all three magazines, loaded two more magazines from the loose rounds, and completed the course of fire.

Scores, as you might imagine, continued to be much lower than in past months. The high score was Ron Lohman's 64. Prizes for B-class went to Todd Basler (50 - 1st place), Jim Eklund Jr. (28 - 2nd place), and Susan Ostfeld (25 - 3rd place). Prizes for A class went to Bob Cashman (49 - 1st place), Gary Baldwin (48 - 2nd place), and Bob Low (46 - 3rd place). These weren't necessarily all of the best scores in each class. Prizes were awarded only if the shooter braved the cold and stayed to the cold and bitter end of the match.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each additional eligible member of the household.
