## Junior Shooters are Champions

The Capitol City Junior Rifle Club won the Junior Club division in Anniston, Alabama. The match was fired July 11-12, 2008. Our team consisted of four shooters, plus one alternate whose score didn't count in the team total; the alternate could be substituted for one of the four regulars in the event of illness or injury. Members were:

- Kyle Rebillion from Tacoma, who will be a senior at Steilacoom HS next year.
- Danny Lowe from Olympia, who will be a sophomore at Black Hills HS next year.
- Josh Pagel from University Place, who graduated from Curtis HS this June.
- Brandon Hergert from Port Angeles, who will be a freshman at Port Angeles HS next year.
- Jennifer Greeves (alternate) from Lacey, who graduated from Timberline HS this June.

The match course each day was 20 shots in each position, prone, standing and kneeling, for possible total of 600 points per shooter per day.

Team standings aside, our five individual finishers placed as follows: Kyle finished in 13th place at 1171 (out of 1200 possible), Danny finished in 15th place at 1170, Josh finished in 17th place at 1168, Brandon finished in 56th place at 1152 and Jennifer finished in 80th place at 1143.

The team was coached by Art Rebillion, who (along with his son Kyle and Josh Pagel) was coming from the USA Shooting National Championships in Georgia, held earlier. Art is one of four Assistant Coaches with our Capitol City Junior Rifle Club and has been to a couple of these events over the past few years.

Capital City beat second place team, from Michigan by 10 points and the third place Georgian team by 15 points.

## Beginner/Intermediate Pistol Match

Shooters are getting used to the new format that allows shooters to choose their own difficulty level at each match. A couple of shooters moved down to the beginner class to test fire new guns or to shoot single action. Also three Intermediate shooters moved up to the advanced class on their second gun to try that course of fire. Scores were excellent overall.

Beginners shot from 12 yards without any time limit. Intermediate shot from 17 yards with no time limit. Advanced shot from the 10 yard line with their weak hand only, the 20 yard line - strong hand only, and the 25 yard line - optional grip. Advanced shooters had varying time limits on each stage.

If you know any beginners who want to learn safety rules and basic shooting skills, bring them to the Beginner/Intermediate match. See you August 16th. As a reminder, this match is being held on the 3rd Saturday because all CCRP ranges will be closed the second Saturday (August 9th) for cleanup.

#### **MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES**

*Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003*

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.
