**Under Old Business** 

Life Member Award- Bob Jamison was awarded a life membership for his services to CCRP that go above and beyond the requested or required. Thank You Bob!

Range Expansion- A motion was made to start the new road construction part of the range expansion project by Larry Lufkin and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Doug Simpson. All members present voted in favor.

Multi Purpose Range Director replacement- Paul Steinman stepped down as MP Range Director. Larry Balestra requested to fill the position and was appointed by Chris Moffet until elections in December.

Office printer- The office printer needs replaced. A new printer is being purchased. Meeting Adjourned at 8:00pm Motion by Larry Lufkin 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ray Crisp. All members present voted in favor.

## **Beginner/Intermediate Pistol May 2009**

The Beginner/Intermediate match drew 21 shooters. We had a beautiful day for shooting although wind did come up at times and blow the tarps around. Eight shooters tried their hand with a second gun. The match included 10 Beginners, 8 Intermediate shooters, and 3 advanced shooters.

The match was 78 rounds shot at bowling pins, paper, and steel. The walk and shoot stage consisted of 6 shots made from a chair and behind a table. Then, the shooter reloaded, shot 3 shots through a barrel from a sitting position, moved to a set of stairs and shot one more target. At the next stage, the shooter shot 3 shots from a rifle then moved to a barrel and shot 3 more shots from the prone position. Finally, shooters picked up a rifle, shot 5 targets a close range, then moved to the final position and shot 3 targets at 40 yards distance. All targets were positioned behind clumps of grass and tree branches so that they were hard to see clearly.

The other three stages were all 18 shots each and included steel targets, paper targets, and bowling pins. Beginners shot from 12 yards without any time limit. Intermediates shot from 18 yards with no time limit. Advanced shot from 25 yards with no time limit.

If you know any beginners who want to learn safety rules and basic shooting skills, send them to the Beginner/Intermediate match on 9th. All other pistol shooters are also invited. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match. As a reminder, we ask that shooters show up at 8 AM to help set up targets for the match and stay and help tear down the targets after the match has been completed. Also, all shooters who have never shot in this match are asked to attend a 30-40 minute briefing which covers match and range safety procedures and commands. Larry Lufkin

## MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
