# **Indoor Rifle League Begins in December**

Four-Position Indoor Smallbore Rifle shooting begins at Capitol City Rifle & Pistol Club Dec. 2. League shooting will be conducted at 7 p.m., Dec. 2 – March 24 at the indoor range.

The first five sessions will be devoted to coaching and practice, with official matches beginning in January. The league will run 12 weeks.

The 40-shot NRA sanctioned matches will be fired in four strings; 10 shots each from the prone, sitting, kneeling and standing positions. The league fee is \$20, targets will be provided and scores can be used for NRA skill classifications in the 4-P Rifle discipline.

Iron sights or scopes may be used. Although single-shot rifles are more prevalent, shooters may use repeaters, loading one round at a time.

Some shooters will use heavy and "highly-accessorized" target rifles. Others may opt for lighter plinker style rifles to improve skills and to gain (or improve) their NRA standing in Sporter Class .22 rifle.

The goal of the league is to have fun while improving rifle skills. The level of competition is up to each individual. Beginners are as welcomed as seasoned match veterans.

Last year's league drew several men and women whose primary interest was Highpower or Silhouette. Winter shooting indoors provided weekly practice, which greatly improved their competitive edge at spring and summer outdoor matches.

# Beginner/Intermediate Pistol November 2009

The Beginner/Intermediate match drew 11 shooters for the November match. It was cold and a bit icy but it was clear and we had a beautiful day for the match. Six shooters tried their hand with a second gun.

The match was 72 rounds shot at bowling pins, paper, and steel. The walk and shoot stage started with the shooter sitting in a chair with gun and all ammo on a table. The shooter stood up, picked up the ammo and gun and moved to the first stage where we shot one small steel target through a barrel. Then, the shooter moved to a second barrel and shot through it at two more steel targets. At the next stage, the shooter shot 2 steel targets through a barrel. Shooters then moved to the 4th station where they shot a single steel target on one side of the barrel, hid behind the barrel while they reloaded, then shot a second steel target. Finally, shooters moved to the final mat, and shot 5 plates off the Texas Star. Shooters were given 90 seconds to complete the entire stage.

The other five stages were all 12 shots each and included steel targets, paper targets, and bowling pins. Stage 1 included the plate rack and dueling tree, shot in any order. Stage 2 included a dueling tree along with a small popper and turning target. This stage was challenging because the turning target didn't allow much time to shoot accurately. Stage 3 had two small and two medium pie plates. The stage was shot in any order but shooters had to put 3 rounds in each plate. Stage 4 included the Texas tree with 3 bowling pins in front of it along with 4 pins on the side. Shooters had to shoot all five plates off the tree, then the 3 pins in front of the tree, followed by the four side pins. Shooters had to shoot the 4 pins in a specific order or none of the pins counted. Stage 5 included a plate rack along with 3 large plates with 3 small plates directly in front of them. Shooters had to knock down the 3 small plates before knocking down the large plates.

Beginners shot from the 12-yard line and could use any grip. Intermediate and Advanced shooters shot from the 20-yard line and also were allowed to use any grip. However, advanced shooters were encouraged to practice shooting with weak and strong hands in preparation for the December match. Ron announced that he planned small prizes for the December match.

Ron also announced that he could not hold the match on our usual date which would be the second Saturday of December. Shooters decided to hold the match on the first Saturday, December 5th, as an alternate. Please mark your calendars for the December match so you don't miss it.

All pistol shooters are invited to the match and you can really hone your accuracy skills with this match. If you know any beginners who want to learn safety rules and basic shooting skills, send them to the Beginner/Intermediate match. Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9MM or larger caliber, and 3 speed loaders or magazines. Crossdraw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match. Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron. We ask that shooters show up at 8 AM to help set up targets for the match and stay and help tear down the targets after the match has been completed. Matches are usually completed by 1 PM.

# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
