Beginner/Intermediate Pistol December 2009

The Beginner/Intermediate match drew 15 shooters for the December match. It was bitterly cold and a bit icy with temperatures just above 20 degrees F when the match started. But it was clear and we had a beautiful day for the match. A couple of propane heaters helped keep the crew warm. Only one shooter, Ken Horton, had the moxey to shoot a second gun.

The match was 72 rounds shot at bowling pins, paper, and steel. The walk and shoot stage started with the shooter sitting in a chair with gun on a table. The shooter stood up, walked to a second table and picked up ammo from a safe. After closing the safe, shooters moved to the first stage where we shot one paper steel target through a barrel. The shooter moved to a second barrel and shot through it at one more paper target. At the next stage, the shooter shot 2 steel targets to the right, then another steel target to the left. Shooters then moved to the 4th station where they shot a single steel popper around the right side of a barrel. Shooters then hid behind the barrel while they reloaded, then shot a second popper around the left side of the barrel. At the final stage, shooters moved to the first mat and shot at two steel plates after which they moved to the second mat and shot 3 small poppers. Shooters were given 100 seconds to complete the entire stage.

The other five stages were all 12 shots each and included steel targets, paper targets, and bowling pins. Stage 1 included the plate rack and assorted bowling pins, shot in any order. Stage 2 included a dueling tree along with assorted steel plates and pins. Shooters had to remember to shoot (Continued on page 4)

the yellow plate first or none of the other targets counted. Stage 3 had small, medium, and large pie plates. The stage was shot in any order but shooters had to put 4 rounds in each plate. Stage 4 included the Texas tree along with assorted bowling pins and plates. Shooters had to shoot all five plates off the tree, then the 3 pins in front of the tree, followed by the four side pins. Stage 5 was all bowling pins set up close together in small groups. Shooters had to knock down the pins one at a time or none of them counted. This stage was made more difficult because the pins sometimes exploded because they were so cold.

Beginners shot from the 12-yard line and could use any grip. Intermediate shooters shot from the 20yard line and also were allowed to use any grip. Advanced shooters shot 4 shots from the beginner line, using either a strong hand, weak hand, or two handed grip – their choice. They then moved to the intermediate line and shot 4 more shots with one of the other two grips. Shooters had to reload during this second 4-shot stage. Finally, advanced shooters, using the last of their three grip choices, shot the last four shots. Advanced shooters went through this same routine at each of the five stages.

Ron brought prizes for the December match. The top prizes were won by Terry Torres, Theresa Dec, and Ron Lohman. Second place winners were Ken Horton, Gary Baldwin, and Gary Thorson. Ron donated his prize and held a shoot-off to determine the winner. Ida Eardley beat Larry Lufkin and Casey Carlson for the win.

All pistol shooters are invited to the Beginner/Intermediate match and you can really hone your accuracy skills with this match. The next match will be held Saturday, January 9. If you know any beginners who want to learn safety rules and basic shooting skills, send them to our match. Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9MM or larger caliber, and 3 speed loaders or magazines. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match. Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron. We ask that shooters show up at 8 AM to help set up targets for the match and stay and help tear down the targets after the match has been completed. Matches are usually completed by 1 PM.

<u>MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES</u> Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
