MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

Saturday morning dawned clear and warmed up real quick, as did Sunday. The slight breeze that kept things from getting too hot on the firing line on Saturday did not appear on Sunday so things got a bit warm that second day of shooting. RSO Tom Brown held the shooter's meeting both mornings and then watched over the shooting range, making sure that things stayed safe. Thanks, Tom, you did a great job as RSO. Thanks also to our NRA scorers, Noel Vaughn and Tom Klugman, who kept everything on the up and up with great expertise and good humor.

A new event this year was the Trapper's Run. Participants had to complete a timed course which included setting a trap, sticking both hawk and knife in a target block, springing the trap and then lighting a candle after starting a fire without matches. Of course, "Mountain Man Rules" applied so there were some very inventive solutions exhibited by contestants. The Trapper's Run was a very popular activity so hopefully it will be continued (and maybe even expanded) next year.

The rendezvous ended Sunday afternoon with the awarding of prizes. Along with certificates for first, second and third places in all events, WSMLA medals were awarded to winners in the rifle matches and to first time shooters. Each shooter was also given a chance to select a prize from the blanket, a long time mountain man tradition. Thanks to all our traders and local merchants who contributed blanket and raffle prizes. During the awards Freetrapper Rowland Zoller was also presented with his mountain man name "Half Cock", commemorating an unfortunate, inopportune and embarassing incident at a match in Puyallup earlier this spring involving a loaded .50 caliber flintlock rifle, a broken sear spring and the sudden and noisy appearance of a rather large hole in the ground at his feet. No more need be said.

Of course, the work doesn't stop when the rendezvous ends so once again the Freetrappers jumped in and did what needed to be done: tearing down the shooting range, boxing up extra prizes, striking the registration tent, policing the event area and then packing everything up and transporting it all back to the club for storage until next year.
