Annual Bowling Pin Trophy Match – August 21, 2011

The Match had up to 17 shooters who came to test their skills at 25 feet against the elusive Bowling Pin. The match has 4 separate categories where the shooter has to knock 6 bowling pin off a 5 x 3 foot table (except in the 32 cal. Match where the pins just have to be knocked over) in thirteen seconds. This is done twelve times for a total of 72 pins. There were crystal mug's awards for the top three in the first 3 matches and the top 5 in the last match. The temperature ranged from the 60's at the start to the low 80's at the end.

The prestigious .32 caliber match was first with Tom Martin winning with a 71. Second went to Jim Due with a 68 score. Third was Gary Thorson with a 62.

Next up was the Single Action (SA) match with Gary Thorson winning with a 71 and close on his heels was Jim Due with a 70. Third was Tom Martin with a 69.

Third match of the day was the Revolver Match. Gary Thorson copied his win in SA and won with a score of 72 out of 72. Well done Gary. Second was Jim Due with a 71 and Third was Gary Gates with a 68.

The final match of the day was the Last Chance. Tom Martin came through with a 72 to win with Jim Due ever so close with a 71 for Second place. Great shooting. Third place had a tie between Gary Baldwin and Gary Thorson with scores of 69. Gary Baldwin won the shoot off to take Third and Gary Thorson got Fourth place. Gary Gates was not far behind with a 68 score for Fifth. "What's Up" with all the Gary's.

There was one unusual gun in the Last Chance match where Harvey Gertson used a Rossi "Ranch Hand". This is a .357 mag. lever action rifle with a 12 inch barrel and short stock. Remember the old TV series "Wanted Dead or Alive" with Steve McQueen. Harvey did have trouble loading and shooting fast enough.

Old Soldier Match – October 23, 2011

Hey shooters, come on out to the October Old Soldier Match. Shooters use an issued military rifle for this 200 yard, 30 shots from the prone position. The rifles have been from the 19th and 20th Century (Springfield Trapdoors, 30-40 Krags, M1 Garand, Mauser's of various countries and calibers, Swiss K31 and Italian rifles but not AR 15). Dig that old military rifle out of storage and come on out and have some fun.

Old Soldier Match – August 28, 2011

There were 10 shooters who came out in good weather to shoot at 200 yards from the prone position. It started out overcast and then cleared up with the temperature going from the low 60's to high 70's with sunshine and very little wind. The military type "dog tag" award went to the top three places.

We had a tie score for first place with a score of 290 between Gary Thorson and Gary Baldwin. The "x" count broke the tie with Gary Thorson taking 1st with a 290-6x and Gary Baldwin with a 290-4x for 2nd place. Tony Minerd was knocked off the 1st place podium for the first time this year but he did take Third place in another tied score with Ken Horton at 283 but Tony won with 12-x's to Ken's 6-x's. Ken took Fourth place. X's do count. There were only 7 points between 1st and 4th place. Good shooting guys.

Between the first and second string of fifteen shots there was a "Bayonet Charge" at a silhouette target around 40 yards down range. The command "Fix Bayonets" was given and then the "Charge" command. Seven shooters jumped from the trenches and charged the enemy and were victorious. No one was injured. Ken Horton did take the head off his target with his Wilkinson sword British bayonet. Ken may even shave with this sharp blade.

After the Old Solder Match there were 6 shooters for the Carbine match. The course of fire was different this time. Since the bayoneted silhouette targets were available they were used. A target with an 11.75 inch bull-seye was placed on the back of the silhouette target. Shooting took place at 50 yards. Forty shots in four stages of 10 shots each all rapid fire with time of thirty seconds each. First stage was prone shooting at the silhouette head, one point for each hit. The other three stages of sitting, kneeling and standing were shot at center of mass on the silhouette target using the bullseye on the back for scoring. The highest score out of a possible 310 points wins. First went to Gary Thorson with a 264 using a M1 Carbine. Second went to Walt Schumacher with a score of 246-1x using an S&W .22 cal AR 15 clone. Fran Huntington was Third with a 232-2x using an AR-15, M4 Carbine.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
