Navigational Failure Report

Ah, the homing instinct wins out in the end! Set up on Friday afternoon with Reliable Tony plus BO and Doug was deceptively easy and well provident because the early morning on the match day was unseasonably frigid. Tony had the fire and coffee going at daybreak so the event went ahead. Seven shooters signed in for the competition and they tested out the new heavy duty turkey targets. Future shooters, be advised, it takes a sharp eye to confirm hits with anything less than a .50 caliber. (Heavy targets, indeed!)

Despite frost and fog, the match proceeded. End results saw Adam Sampson garner in both the luck matches. (Seems like this has happened before.) Individual match awards were enhanced by a special award (a can of Vienna Sausage) for the lowest score. Top three had a choice of Beef Stick, beef Kielbasa or Beef jerky. **Trade Gun:** BO achieved the Vienna sausage award leaving 1st to Mike Nesbitt, 2nd to Adam Sampson, and 3rd went to Rowland Zoller. **Rifle:** again BO was first to the table for his sausage, followed by Mike Nesbitt in 1st place, Doug Simpson taking 2nd (Mike & Doug tied with a one point tie breaker advantage going to Mike) and Adam Sampson placing 3rd. **Pistol:** Rowland Zoller was the anchorman winning the sausage, with Mike Nesbitt in 1st, Adam Sampson taking 2nd and Doug Simpson placing 3rd. The aggregate blanket featured mystery brown bag packages for selection: 1st-Mike Nesbitt, 2nd-Doug Simpson, 3rd-Adam Sampson, 4th-Will Ulry, 5th-Rowland Zoller, 6th-John Barberi, and 7th-BO Brown.

Side features included first look at the custom Lyman Plains Rifle for the 2012 raffle. The Free Trappers meeting determined to continue individual medals for major event recognition at Rain-Dee-Voo and Oregon Trail Days. We selected a medallion design and will purchase fifty of them for Rain-Dee-Voo 2012. Final changes for Rain-Dee-Voo rules were approved. The match rules were also discussed for the Center fire Black Powder Rifle event to be held after the January M.L. match. Briefly those rules include; Black Powder calibers, pre-1890 in either single shot or lever action repeaters will be shot at 50 & 100 yard ranges, preferably with black powder propellant, 20 shots at paper targets. Shooting positions to be either body support or cross sticks, (no bench rest). A more complete set of rules and details are available on request from Bob Gietz, M.L. The Winter .22 cal Bullseye Pistol League Starts January 2, 2012

The .22 cal Bullseye Pistol League is on Monday nights with a 6:30 and 7:30 pm relay. The shooting is done at 50 feet at the Indoor Range at targets with a bullseye (black center section). Course of fire consist of 60 rounds per score. There are three shooting sequences/types: Slow Fire (10 rounds in ten minutes), Timed Fire (5 rounds in 20 seconds) and Rapid Fire (5 rounds in 10 seconds). Twenty rounds are shot in each type. The shooting is done one-handed with open (iron) or optical sights (red dot or scope). Shooters may use a semi-auto or revolver however it is more difficult to shoot a revolver in Rapid Fire. The League runs for 11 weeks. Shooters submit 10 scores to be eligible for league awards. The League is NRA Sanctioned.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES***Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003***

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
