



MISSION STATEMENT

The object of this organization shall be the encouragement of organized rifle, shotgun and pistol shooting among residents of our community, with a view toward better knowledge on the part of citizens of our community of the safe handling and the proper care of firearms, and the development of those characteristics of honesty, good fellowship, self discipline and self reliance that are the essentials of good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism.

Capitol City Practical Shotgun Match

This match is based on the principles of multi-gun competition and most of the rules used are taken from the IMGA rules. I have modified them slightly to work with Capitol City rules, and to make it easier for new shooters to compete also. This is a fast paced competition where the goal is to complete the course as quickly and accurately as possible.

We will have four divisions that should accommodate everyone who wants to participate. Open- pretty much anything goes, comps, detachable magazines, optics. If you can think it up (and its safe) bring it.

Tactical- Semi auto, No more than 8 rounds in the tube and 1 round in the chamber at the start. No comps, no optics, no detachable magazines

Pump- Same as tactical but pump action shotguns only

Cowboy- SASS rules apply.

The match fee is \$10 and until we have too many shooters we are going to allow multiple guns, ie. A single shooter could shoot in open and then pump. This will be an extra \$5 per gun.

I am going to keep the round count around 80 rounds for now and 7-1/2 promo (wal-mart) loads should work for most stages, I would bring a box of high base for longer shots or the possible MGM spinner.

The idea is to have this match turn into a 2 gun, pistol shotgun match where both firearms will be used for the courses of fire. I plan on moving in this direction later in the summer.

Come on out and give it a try!

Scheduled for the 3rd Saturday of each month, but watch the calendar as a couple of dates have conflicted and there won't be a match that month

High Power Rifle - March

It was a beautiful day in the High Power neighborhood, with seven riflemen turning out for the March CMP Service Rifle match. After the January snow & ice storm, this has been the first time we've had a service rifle match since last November. The first few *sighter* rounds blew out the rust from the barrels, and then we had some decent scores.

We had an even match field with three AR-15's and three M1A's. Fran brought out his new Spring-field Armory M1A Super Match. He had to oil it down after everybody got done drooling on it. Tony Minerd won the Prone Slow Fire, Prone Rapid Fire, and Sitting Rapid Fire stages, and then won the Match with a score of 482-17X. Gary Thorson won the Standing Slow Fire stage. Medals and Distinguished points went to the top three places, with an extra Distinguished point to each stage winner. Somebody needs to slow this Tony character down....

Following the CMP match we had our .22 rimfire *Rapid Fire Silhouette* match. We set up alternating orange and yellow metal silhouette targets, with 10 of each color at 25 and 50 yards, and 5 pigs of each color at 75 yards. The course of fire is – two shooters on the line, one for each color. Shoot as fast as you can until you knock all of your color down. Run through twice. The fastest time wins *Braggin' Rights*. Match winner was Gary Thorson with a time of 1 minute, 22 seconds.

Don't forget: The M1 Garand match starts the 2nd Sunday of each month, beginning on April 8th. After the M1 Garand match there will be a Lever Action / Single Shot centerfire rifle match – the course of fire is a mystery known only to Fran.

Following the Old Soldier's Match, we had our Carbine Match. Match Director Gary Thorson got everybody's anxiety up with a new course of fire – but it proved to be a lot of fun for everyone. The devious course of fire was:

- · Come to the line with 2 magazines loaded with 10 rounds each
- At the command to fire, shoot 5 rounds offhand at 50 yards
- Then go to kneeling and fire 5 more rounds at 50 yards
- Then go to prone, do a magazine change, and fire 10 rounds prone at 100 yards
- · Time limit for all this was 2 minutes.
- · We repeated this course of fire twice, for a total of 40 rounds expended

And Harvey impressed us all by shooting the carbine match with a lever action Marlin 1894 in .38 Special. Harvey knows how to speed load a lever gun!

Here are the running points totals for the CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman. Tony Minerd passed the 20 point mark today to be the first to qualify as a CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman. Good shooting, Tony!

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

Good Saturday at CCRP

The day following Good Friday must logically be Good Saturday, right? And a good Saturday it was, indeed, with amazingly fine weather after a brisk and chilly beginning. Thanks to the diligent efforts of the Puget Sound Free Trappers and the Capitol City Bowmen all events, including muzzleloading, tomahawk throwing, and archery, went without a hitch. Total attendance at our "2012 Spring Hunt" was 49 scouts; 23 from Troop 226, 17 from Troop 300 and 9 more from Troop 317.

Four groups were created to stage thru the three separate events. The Washington State Muzzle-loaders Association provided medals for the top competitors as well as furnishing resources for the Black Powder Range. Event winners were: Aggregate; 1st-Connor Simons, Tr 300, 2nd-Tore Lund, Tr 300, 3rd-Lucas Babcock, Tr 226. Rifle; 1st-Connor Simons, Tr 300, 2nd-Ian Allards, Tr 226, 3rd-Isaac Engle, Tr 300. Archery; 1st-Joshua Corwin. Tr 300, 2nd-Forest Grandorf, Tr 226, 3rd-Ben Ancel, Tr 317. Tomahawk Throwing; 1st-Anthony Brooks, Tr 226, 2nd-Eli Ames, Tr 226, 3rd-David Bowker, Tr 226. Each activity group was provided a selection of blanket prize items to recognize their individual members. Excellent prizes, in addition to the medals from the WSMA, were donated by Wholesale Sports and Cabela's.

An extensive roster of the Free Trappers came early (to set up the ranges on Friday) and stayed late to score and reward the participants. Key members were Will Ulry and Craig Brown, both Range Masters. Tim Sampson and crew on the Tomahawk Range plus Sherrie Crisp, Ray Crisp and Bob Jamison on the Archery Range. Don Kerr and Glen Sutt in full period attire provided a demonstration of period flintlock rifle loading and marksmanship for each group. Then a full "brigade" of Free Trappers kept the rifles loaded and gave individual attention to each young shooter. After action comments from the several scoutmasters were uniformly positive and bode well for a repeat event in 2013 particularly with compliments to the weatherman.
