

Gotta love those Coast Guard engineers. (How did you get all that diesel fuel on your hat, Bill?) (And, yes... the Coast Guard still uses M1's in Boot Camp!)

Joel Beck made a fine showing for his first time ever shooting an M1. Joel scored a 396-2X, and **won the Rapid Fire Sitting stage with a 93!** Good shooting Joel! (And Joel has dibbs on club loaner M1 #6 – so don't anybody even think of touching that rifle.) [Hey Joel: Up 18; Right 2] J

Congratulations to Rod McDonald who scored enough points on Sunday to earn his CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman certification.

Following the M1 Match, we had our Lever Action/Single Shot / Open (shoot anything you got) match. We had 5 shooters hang around for that one. We shot "5V" targets, 10 rounds offhand at 50 yards, and 10 rounds kneeling at 100 yards – all single load slow fire. Total possible points of 100.

So that our new shooters what we mean by "distinguished points", we are awarding "extra credit" points for placing in high power matches. Shooters can earn points in the M1 Garand Match, the CMP/NRA Service Rifle Match, and the Old Soldier Match. Points are awarded for placing in a match, and an extra point for winning a stage in a match. Shooters who accumulate 20 or more points during the 2012 shooting season will be awarded with a certificate designating them as a Capitol City Rifle & Pistol Club *Distinguished Rifleman* for the year. Once a shooter earns Distinguished, then any further points he earns are passed down to the next highest non-distinguished shooter.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
