Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.

# MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

NRA membership (required)

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

Today was the final Old Soldiers Match of the season. Fran will be tallying up the season scores and present the season Old Soldier league awards at the CMP match in January.

Today was also the final high power match of the 2012 season, and the final opportunity to earn CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman points for this year. Check out the attachment to see the final points totals for Distinguished Riflemen. Starting in January, we will "clear the books", and everyone will start over for the 2013 Distinguished Riflemen qualifications.

Following the Old Soldier Match, we held our Carbine match with seven shooters. Since we had a limited number of target stands, we had a "Team Match". We chose up two teams, appropriately names "Left Team" and "Right Team". We ran our standard 5 rounds standing, 5 rounds kneeling at 50 yards, and 10 rounds prone at 100 yards, and ran through the course twice for a total of 40 rounds. Left Team shot on the left targets, Right Team shot on the right targets. (Somebody, please, think up something different for the Carbine Match! I'm running out of ideas.) We had a variety of "carbines", so we didn't have a time limit - just try to shoot rapid fire. It was really fun watching Fran Huntington manipulate his Soviet Mosin Nagant Model 38 Carbine, belching flames 2 feet out of the muzzle. I think they call that a hand held artillery piece. And now I know why the Soviets has so many casualties during the war... Anyway, the Right Team won the carbine match, scoring 143 to 132. Because they were Right, right?

OK, Gentlemen, this wraps up 2012. We start again on the 4th Sunday in January with the CMP Match. Invite your friends and let's have another fun High Powered year. Here's the format for our 2013 High Power Matches: (all high power matches shot at 200 yards)

CMP/NRA Service Rifle Match - Odd numbered months beginning the 4th Sunday in January: (Google NRA Service Rifle rules)

- \* 20 rounds slow fire from the prone position in 20 minutes
- \* 10 rounds rapid fire from the prone position in 70 seconds with a magazine change
- \* 10 rounds rapid fire from the sitting position in 60 seconds with a magazine change
- \* 10 rounds slow fire from the standing position in 10 minutes
- \* 50 rounds total, maximum of 500 points

Old Soldiers Match - Even numbered months beginning the 4th Sunday in February: World War 2 vintage or older standard issue military rifles, from any country.

\* Two strings of 15 rounds, slow fire prone, in 15 minutes each. 30 rounds total, maximum of 300 points

M1 Garand Match - 2nd Sunday April through September

\* Course of fire the same as the CMP/NRA Service Rifle Match – but only M1 Garands.

The club has M1 Garand loaner rifles that can be used, free of charge, for any high power rifle match. You just need to purchase and use club ammunition at \$6.00 per box of 20.
