Beginner/Intermediate Handgun Match

Good training for those that carry concealed in cold weather zones.

22 Shooters came out to shoot 32 guns and all had a good time, especially around 10:00 AM when the sun got out of bed and showed it's smiley face (if you have ever shot on the Action Pistol Range you know that when the sun comes up it is right in the shooter's eyes).

We had 6 Single Action shooters that started us off at 8:00 AM with a new 50 round course of fire. Gary Baldwin was the leader of the pack with a 46, Paul Glasgow followed with a 44, and Dick Smith placed 3rd with a score of 42.

The Beginner Class (14 shooters) was led by Toni Mitchell with a score of 41 (Glock 40), Rich Ganns (1911 45) followed with a 37, and Robert Jones (Sig 9mm P226) came in 3rd with a score of 36.

The Intermediate Class (4 shooters) was led by Terry Miller (STI Edge 40) who shot his first perfect score, Linda Hildabrand (S&W 357 6 inch) followed with a 49, and Paul Glasgow (1911 45) came in third with a score of 33. It looks to me like Terry Miller and Linda Hildebrand are taking a trip to the Advanced Class. Congratulations!

The Advanced Class (4 shooters) top spot was shared by Gary Baldwin (Ruger 6in.357 GP 100) and Larry Schadt (6in.S&W 357) shooting scores of 46. Dick Smith (6in. S&W 357) took the third spot with a score of 45.

We had 5 new shooters 2 of which came from our Saturday Beginner Training Class. All of the new shooters had a good time and found out where they need to go to work to improve their skills.

The Beginner/Intermediate Match will continue as a 50 round match until such time as ammunition and reloading components are available again in ample supply.

The March Match will be on the 9th and it will be a Barbeque Match. The fee is \$20 and you can shoot 2 guns. The Single Action Shooters will start at 8:00 AM and the regular match will start at 9:00 AM and all will eat at 11:30 AM. The menu: Bacon wrapped jalapeño poppers, Ribs, Chicken, Polish sausage, baked beans, a salad and desert. I can guarantee you will be ready for a nap when you're done eating.

Mark your schedule for March 9 for the next Beginner Match and we will see you at the Action Pistol Range. Remember, our matches are usually held the second Saturday of each month.

Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9 mm or larger caliber, and at least 3 speed loaders or magazines. Four are better. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and any practice shooting you do. Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.

<u>MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES</u> Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually.
