MAY SUNSHINE AND BLACK POWDER SMOKE

The forecast came true and the Free Trappers came on schedule so all that remained was to generate a range full of black powder smoke in order to make a nearly perfect Saturday. Starting with an early set up and a Free Trappers' meeting, 11 buckskinners were present for the event. This match involved only rifle and pistol for the muzzle loading portion with trade guns excluded for this match only. With capable assistance of "Reliable Tony" and Tom Brown for coffee and scoring, the events moved smoothly thru the morning. The luck shoot prizes went (both) to Ron Foly. Individual events were: Pistol; 1st-Bob DeLisle, 2nd-Adam Sampson & 3rd-Mike Nesbitt. Rifle; 1st-Tim Sampson, 2nd- Allen Cunniff and 3rd- Kent Dunn. There were no blanket prizes selected due to the low level of participation but the Aggregate Scores went to; 1st-Adam Sampson, 2nd-Tim Sampson, 3rd-Mike Nesbitt, 4th-Bob Delisle, 5th-Rowland Zoller, 6th-Kent Dunn, 7th-Dave Perry, 8th-Allen Cunniff, 9th-Ron Foly and 10th (tie) Frank Ponceroff and Roy Williams.

The Free Trappers meeting held by Boosway Tim Sampson focused on needed preparations for the next Rain-Dee-Voo. There was a general consensus that schedules and events were suitable to continue with more emphasis placed on the Friday Nite Dinner, possibly reducing the menus to more simple foods. Mike Nesbitt volunteered to be Trail Chief again, Dave Perry will run the Knife & Hawk, and Rowland Zoller will be involved with registration, Bob Gietz will manage prizes and awards. Please be reminded that the Trail work day is scheduled for the third Saturday in August, August 17th with the alternate date of September 14th. Workers needed for the wood cutting party on May 19th was also publicized.

After conclusion of the muzzle loading event the range was reopened for an Old West Centerfire Match. Seven shooters were present, all were using Sharps Model 1874 configurations from two sources in at least three different calibers. Those participants and equipment were:

We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and any practice shooting you do. **Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.**

High Power Shooters

Spring is here, pollen is in the air, partly sunny, partly cloudy, partly showers, targets partly wet for the April Old Soldier Match. But no blown down targets and the pasters mostly stayed pasted. Perfect Olympia day for a rifle match.

We had 13 shooters come out today for a good time, and some pretty good scores with those vintage military rifles. Our match winner today was Gary Baldwin, who scored 290-4X out of a possible 300. Gary was shooting a Mosin Nagant M44, with the bayonet fixed! Seems the only way he can get it to shoot straight is with the bayonet out. Makes you wonder what the Russians were thinking...

Second and third place were separated by X count. Rod McDonald took second with 289-4X, and Gary Thorson took third with 289-2X. Fourth and fifth were also separated by X count – 4th going to Bruce Fockler with 280-5X, and 5th to Ken Horton with 280-1X. Makes for a fine and exciting day!

Also, CONGRATULATIONS to Rod McDonald who earned enough Distinguished points today to put him over 20, and to become our first CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman for the 2013 season. See the distinguished points at the bottom of this email.

Following the Old Soldier Match, we had 11 shooters stay for the Carbine Match. This year, we are running the Carbine match using the CMP carbine match course of fire. All targets are at 100 yards, and we shoot:

- 10 rounds slow fire prone in 10 minutes
- 10 rounds rapid fire prone in 70 seconds
- 10 round rapid fire sitting or kneeling in 60 seconds
- 10 round slow fire standing in 10 minutes

Match winner was Rod McDonald shooting 363-4X out of a possible 400.

M1 Garand and Bolt Action Matches

May 12, 2023

Another fine day for some shooting fun on Sunday, we had a light turnout for the M1 and Bolt Action Matches with just 7 guys showing up. None the less, the weather cooperated and the scores weren't too bad. Gary Baldwin shot an excellent Prone Slow Fire Stage with a 192-4x. His overall score suffered because of the Sitting Rapid Fire Stage with what we'll call some 'mechanical' trouble. The Match win went to Gary Thorson with a 461-6x, good shooting Gary. If my calculations are correct, Gary also earned the Club's Distinguished Shooter status as a result of his win today. JD is quickly coming up to speed since he started shooting with us in the April Old-Soldiers Match. JD was right behind Gary Baldwin in the Prone Slow Fire Stage with a 188-5x.

Integrated into the M1 Match this year we're running a 100 yard Bolt Action Match. The Bolt Action Match uses reduced 200 yard targets and shoots the same stages and positions as the M1 Match. We've had quite a variety of rifles showing up and the participants seem to be enjoying the event. If we discount Rod using a 'scoped' model 70 and Gary Thorson needing an additional 30 seconds to shoot his rapid fire stages (He claimed his rifle wouldn't eject the spent rounds...), the group on the whole is showing some impressive close scores. J

Anyway, even though we had a light turn-out, it was a great day for some shooting fun. We hope to see more people for the next matches. Speaking of that, the CMP Match is coming up Sunday, May 26th. We hope to see you there.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
