SIX SHARPS SHOOTERS SHOOTING SHARPS SHARPLY

Admittedly that's not much of a tongue twister but if the intent was for brevity, that would closely summarize the June 1st match results from the Black Powder range. Saturday, (the 1st) saw a half dozen eager shooters ready for the event with observers to watch: Relible Tony the coffeemeister, Dave Dolliver to observe and assist in scoring and Bill Wirtaanen plus Ron Folty's friend (Kay)who just came to see what the noise was all about. Two relays were fired under nearly ideal shooting conditions, considering the wind and sun glare. As before all participants used 1874 model Sharps from two different sources. Groups and scores attest to the improved conditions and quality of shooters. At the conclusion of the match, prizes from C. Sharps Arms provided thru Mike Nesbitt were awarded to the top three shooters.

And just after the awards were given the range was opened again. That's when Kay was "introduced" to a Highwall from C. Sharps Arms in .32-40 caliber. She only fired a few shots at the two "armor plate" gongs but she never missed. Maybe she'll get a Highwall of her own in .32-40 or .38-55 and become one of our black powder cartridge shooters.

Beginner Intermediate Handgun Match Ron Lohman - Match Director

June the 8th was another wonderful day for a Handgun Match especially because after the match was over we got to sit down to our 2nd BBQ of the year. The day didn't start out that good for our Match Director Ron as he over slept and left both of his cooking set up crew standing on the range waiting for him (it couldn't have anything to do with only getting 3 hours sleep). Ron arrived at 5:50 AM (almost an hour late) and set up was frantic for a short while but settled down to comfortable pace in a little over an hour after we got powered up and food was on both smokers cooking.

33 shooters turned out to challenge the 50 shot, 5 stage match and shot 58 guns of considerably different makes, types, and calibers putting a little over 2900 rounds downrange in 2 hours and 20 minutes. Everyone pitched in and did their jobs extremely well, leaving me, Burt Miller, and Gerold Trusty alone to cook the lunch meal.

Ida Eardley and Barb Rheault handled all of the registration and money. Frank Bennett and Dick Smith ran the firing lines in Bays 2 and 3 and Larry Lufkin handled the first time shooter training. I did the Safety Meeting and Stage explanation and then turned them loose to see who was going to be the first inline to eat. I told them we would have food on the table at 11:30 AM.

I made the 11:30 time table on the nose, but not before they had finished the match, put everything away including guns and equipment, and were milling around the cook site at 11:22 AM. I just love it when a plan comes together (even when you are late to work). It's really rewarding to have good people working with you. I'm not going to go into the menu or tell how good the food was but I can tell you there was not much left and everyone was stuffed with a smile on their face. You don't want to miss the last BBQ match this year in September!

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Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9 mm or larger caliber, and at least 3 speed loaders or magazines. Four are better. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and any practice shooting you do. **Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use**.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
