There wasn't a spare moment from 7:30 AM on as paper targets were stood in place, courses of fire and stage numbers were placed appropriately, and training targets were put in place for new shooter training. Sign ups started at 7:40 for the Single Action Shooters and everyone was on a mission to get ready to start the day.

We had 9 Single Action Shooters hit the line at 8:00 AM but didn't get started until 8:05 as we had one late sign in. A score of 50 gave you bragging rights for this month and less than 50 meant you couldn't brag as much! The results are as follows:

Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9 mm or larger caliber, and at least 3 speed loaders or magazines. Four are better. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and any practice shooting you do. Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.

High Power Shooters

CONGRATULATIONS to Gary Baldwin on becoming the 4th high power shooter to earn the 2013 CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman qualification.

On Sunday, June 23, we had 13 high power rifle shooters turn out for the Old Soldier Match. Eight shooters stayed after for the Carbine Match.

We had nice weather with no rain until after we were all done, then the downpour happened! We also had a nice collection of vintage military rifles, and most of them were American made (buy American). It was interesting to see Harvey's rare Luxemburg Army FN-49. I never even knew Luxemburg had an army; I just figured the police could handle it in a country that small.

As the scores will show, we have a bunch of fine shooters, shooting fine old rifles. The top 5 shooters were separated by 11 points, and all 5 were above 285 out of a possible 300 on the 200 yard targets. Great shooting guys!

The match winner was Fran Huntington with 294-6X. Second was Gary Thorson with 289-5X. Third was Gary Baldwin at 288-9X. Fourth was Bill Stull at 285-4X. And fifth went to Ken Horton at 279-4X. An honorable mention goes to Rod McDonald who shot a not-so-old-soldier M1A for a practice score of 288-6X.

Following the Old Soldier Match, we had 8 shooters stay for the Carbine Match. Fran Hunting was a force to be reckoned with today, also taking 1st in the Carbine Match with a score of 359-4X out of a possible 400 on the 100 yard reduced target.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
