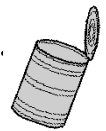




# The Plinker

## **What 50-Yard Targets?**

That was the universal exclamation at the October muzzleloading match on Saturday, October 5th. Visibility on the range at the start of the day's events was quite a problem due to fog settling in right in front of some very bright sunshine. Add to that a blend of a dozen or so shots with black powder from our muzzleloading rifles and it created an overwhelming and very complete obscuration of the down-range facility. You might say that some of our shots were fired in the dark although the exact opposite is true. Fortunately the fog and some of our gunsmoke dissipated before too long and let the shooting match continue. Five Free Trappers were present and the low attendance was attributed to early hunting adventures. We'll listen for some good stories next month.

As to the competition results, starting with the Luck shoots: Bob DeLisle won both the Mike Fink target and the mystery card shoot. This month all the participants hit their cards with the winner determined by high card and Bob's card won out by recourse to the tie-breaker. Individual match prizes were pumpkins of assorted sizes, donated by the Rodriguez farm from Adna. Pistol awards were; 1st-Mike Nesbitt, 2nd-Bob DeLisle, and 3rd-Frank Ponceroff. Rifle winners were; 1st-Don Kerr, 2nd-Bob DeLisle, & 3rd-Mike Nesbitt. Trade Gun; 1st-Bob DeLisle, 2nd-Don Kerr, & 3rd-Frank Ponceroff. Aggregate awards, combining rifle and pistol scores ranked; 1st- Don Kerr, 2nd-Bob DeLisle, 3rd-Mike Nesbitt, 4th-Kent Dunn and 5th-Frank Ponceroff.

Non-shooting assistance was provided by Reliable Tony Yaklich for coffee and fire tending along with Dave Dolliver for target scoring and checking.

Absent was the Boosway, so no Free Trappers meeting was held. Intent is to have the Raffle Rifle ready for ticket sales at the next monthly shoot. That shoot will be on Saturday, November 2. This will be the annual Turkey Shoot with furnished aggregate prizes for all participants and the shooting fee will be \$15.00.

## Beginner/ Intermediate Handgun Match

Saturday October 12<sup>th</sup> turned out to be a good day for a handgun match despite what the weatherman had been saying all week. We had a little light fog in the early morning but no rain to speak of as the last of the stand up targets were put in place.

21 shooters signed up to shoot this match and shot a total of 42 guns. Not all shooters shot 2 guns, as some of us shot 3 guns, putting over 2100 rounds down range safely in just over 2 hours. That is no record by any means because there was a lot of conversation and fun in between those shots.

Single Action Shooters started promptly at 8:00 AM (nothin's too early for Single Action Shootin). We just did get the horses tied up it time to get the shootin started by 8:00 AM. We had 9 Single Action Shooters hit the line to start the day off with a bang. I do mean a real bang because we don't use those "tink – tink" loads that the Cowboy shooters have to use. When a 300 grainer traveling at 900 feet per second hits a 12 inch standing plate it drives it to the ground like it was hit with a sledge hammer (ah yes, boys and girls with their toys, you just can't have too much horsepower). It is a good thing we have AR 500 steel. A perfect score is 50; with alibis less. After the smoke and debris cleared and the cannons were put away:

There's nothing like throwing a little kink into plan just before you get to start.

Those of you that are still wondering where all the bullets went, don't lose faith as you are just beginning and are in the learning stage. **Mark your schedule for September 14th for the next Beginner Match and we will see you at the Action Pistol Range. Remember, our matches are usually held the second Saturday of each month.**

Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9 mm or larger caliber, and at least 3 speed loaders or magazines. Four are better. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and any practice shooting you do. **Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.**

### **MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES**

***Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003***

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

**(GUESTS:** Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
