High Power Shooters

Sunday, Nov. 24 was cold and foggy. But we still had 6 hardy souls show up for the last CMP/NRA Service Rifle match of the year.

We want to extend a welcome to first time shooter Gentry Taylor. Gentry's daughter is a member of the junior team, so Gentry is not unfamiliar with our range. But this was his first time trying our high power match. It takes a few times to get the hang of what we are doing, so keep coming back, Gentry!

It was so foggy in the morning that we couldn't see the 200 yard line. Waiting for the fog to lift was a futile effort. So we ran the .22 rimfire rapid fire silhouette match first. At least we could see to 75 yards. We had a minor "timekeeper" malfunction on one of Rod McDonals's strings, but he still turned in the fastest time to win the match.

After the silhouette match, the fog cleared just enough that we could see the black at 200 yards, and most of us could see the scoring rings and numbers through our spotting scopes. But all you really need to see is your front sight post anyway, right?

Fran Huntington proved that you don't need to be able to see anything to run up an impressive score. Fran handily won the match, and took high scores in rapid prone (99-1X), rapid sitting (99-4X), and offhand (93-1X). Great shooting, Fran!

Ken Horton had a malfunction with his FN FAL, and didn't finish. (Buy American, Ken).

Be sure to come out on Sunday, Dec. 22 for the final Old Soldier Match of the year.

Also, starting in January, after each high power match we will be holding our "So you think you're a Sniper, huh?" match. Bring out your favorite Sniper rifle. As a reminder, here's how it will work:

We will hang a 6-inch gong out at 200 yards. (That's 3 MOA, piece of cake) Shooters will each ante up with \$1.00.

You can use any kind of rifle you want, any kind of sights or scopes. We will shoot one at a time at the gong, and record the hits. You should only need about 10 rounds of ammo. Well, maybe more.

You will have 15 seconds from the "Fire" command to load and get off your shot.

First position will be **prone**. We will run through the line 3 times in prone position. You can use a sling, a bipod, or a rucksack to rest your rifle on in prone. **HOWEVER**, if you use a bipod, it must remain attached to the rifle for sitting and standing positions. If you use a rucksack, you will wear it for sitting and standing positions. If you use a sling, you can't get into your sling until the Fire command is given.

There will be no other forms of support. There will be NO using the shooting benches, no bench rest equipment. These are "field expedient" sniper positions.

Second position will be **sitting or kneeling** (your choice). We will run through the line 2 times. (or we might make it sitting **and** kneeling if people don't miss enough)

Last position will be *SUPPORTED STANDING*. You can lean on or rest your rifle against one of the roof support posts on the firing line.

Everybody will get a chance to shoot 5 shots.

Highest number of "hits" wins the pot. If we have a tie after Supported Standing, those with tie scores will go into a sudden death shoot off from **Unsupported Standing**. When you miss, you're out. Last man standing wins the pot.

<u>MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES</u> Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS</u>: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
