

MISSION STATEMENT

The object of this organization shall be the encouragement of organized rifle, shotgun and pistol shooting among residents of our community, with a view toward better knowledge on the part of citizens of our community of the safe handling and the proper care of firearms, and the development of those characteristics of honesty, good fellowship, self discipline and self reliance that are the essentials of good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism.

World War 1 started 100 years ago this month. As a tribute to those who served and sacrificed in that conflict, we asked the high power shooters to bring out their World War 1 vintage Old Soldier rifles for the August Old Soldier Match. We had a great turnout of 15 shooters on the line. Fitting for the occasion, we had 5 British rifles, 2 German rifles, 3 WW1 vintage U.S. rifles, and 4 later issue U.S. rifles. And then there was the Israeli Tavor...

These surplus rifles (and surplus shooters) CAN SHOOT! The top 10 places in the match scored 250 or better out of a possible 300 points on the 200 yard targets.

The high scores for the day went to Rod (New Soldier) McDonald with his Israel Weapon Industries TAVOR bullpup in 5.56 mm. Rod shot an impressive 294-7X. However, this was an Old Soldier match, and the match win went to Tony Minerd shooting a U.S. Model 03-A3 for a score of 284-3X. The other highpoint of the day was that Ken Horton earned enough points to make CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman. Congratulations, Ken.

Following the Old Soldier Match we had the Sniper Challenge. Gary Thorson won the pot hitting 5 out of 5.

Last but not the least of the fun was the .22 rimfire rapid fire silhouette match. We had two new competitors show up and wanted to shoot the match; Phil Thomas and Danny Thomas. These guys may be new competitors, but they are definitely not new shooters. Danny Thomas won the match with the fastest ever recorded time of 41 seconds! That's to clean 25 targets spread out at 25, 50, and 75 yards. Great shooting, Danny!

Beginner/Intermediate Handgun Match

Friday August 15th was a great day for setting up a handgun match with lots of sunshine and fresh baked cookies. Because we were a week out of sequence (due to a family reunion commitment) and pushing up against Gary Baldwin's annual Bowling Pin Match we decided to help Gary out and help him set up his match so we could shoot it the day before his Sunday match. Setup went really fast as we had 11 people present for set up (even had enough cookies) and those of us that ran our match the next were shooting at 10:30 AM.

Saturday morning the 16th was also great and we put 11 Single Action Shooters on the line at 8:00 AM. In Gary's Match each pin must be cleared off the table to score a hit. Because we are the Beginners and shoot some minor calibers we only had to knock them down to score in our match. Gary's Match is 72 shots and has 6 pins per table, but our match is 50 shots with a combination of 2 tables with 9 pins and 4 tables with 8 pins. Gary's Match is timed and ours was not as we are trying to teach accuracy before we apply the speed. The Intermediate and Advanced Shooters made a game out of it though to see who could take out 50 pins in the least amount of shots. The results for single action were:

27 Shooters shot 55 guns during the competition and we had a lot of fun. You will notice that all of the scores were high as none of the Beginner Matches are shot at 25 feet (but the Bowling Pin Matches are). We shoot a minimum distance of 45 feet because of steel plate bounce back. Just because we shot at 25 feet didn't mean nobody missed. As an Advanced Shooter, I'm still wondering where 2 of those misses went besides into the berm.

Start loading your ammo now and start building up an appetite because the month of September is upon us and this will be our last BBQ of the year. Remember \$20 lets you shoot 2 guns and pays for your meal. A better deal is not to be found anywhere. See you there!

Mark your schedule for September 13th for the next Beginner/Intermediate Match and we will see you at the Action Pistol Range. Remember, our matches are usually held the second Saturday of each month.

Shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol - semi or revolver - of 9 mm or larger caliber, and at least 3 speed loaders or magazines. Four are better. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and any practice shooting you do. Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.

High Power Shooters

We had 11 shooters turn out on a beautiful July Sunday morning for the CMP/NRA format Service Rifle Match. It was a challenge getting started with the sun hitting the shooters in the face, and the targets in the shade. By the Rapid Fire Prone stage, the lighting conditions eased up, and old eyes adjusted, for some good shooting fun. Tony Minerd brought out a new Match Rifle to play with; a Eliseo R5 in 6 mm XC. (Google it!) Being a Match Rifle, Tony didn't qualify for Service Rifle medals, but he posted the high score of the day shooting 479-12X. Tony also posted the high scores in Slow Fire Prone and Rapid Fire Prone, with 197-8X and 96-2x, respectively. Tony then must have gotten tired, because a couple of lowly AR-15 Service Rifles got the best of him in Rapid Sitting and Slow Fire Standing.

The match win went to Fran Huntington shooting an AR-15 Service Rifle for 468-8X. Fran also posted a phenomenal 96-2X in Slow Fire Standing! Fran claims he hasn't been practicing.

Rod McDonald earned enough points today to become the 5th shooter this year to qualify as a CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman. Congratulations, Rod!

Following the Service Rifle Match we had our Carbine match. This match is a lot of fun. Shooters start with two magazines loaded with 10 rounds each. The match is shot on the old "5V" targets at 40 yards. At the "fire" command, shoot 5 rounds standing, then go to kneeling and shoot 5 rounds, then go to prone, reload, and shoot 10 rounds – all in 1 minute! After the first 1 minute string we score and paste the targets. Then we run the string a second time for a total of 40 shots, and a possible high score of 200.

Rod McDonald won both strings and the match with 193-10X. Rod was shooting an FN PS-90 (Yeah, Google that one too). I could have swore I saw an IDF soldier coming out of a Hamas tunnel with that thing....

We finished off the day with the "So you think you're a Sniper, Huh" challenge. We had 9 shooters stay for the challenge on the 6inch gong at 200 yards. Gary Thorson took the pot with 5 out of 5 hits. But the real excitement was that we had four shooters tie for 2^{nd} with 4 hits each. You guys are getting GOOD!

High Power Shooters,

It seems our high power rifle shooters are much more competent with World War 2 M1 Garand battle rifles than they are with Readin', Writin', and Rithmatic. Tony Minerd cheated himself out of 1st place with a 10 point math error. But being the pillar of honesty and integrity that he is, Fran double checked Tony's math and fixed his score. Congratulations, Tony! You WON! Bring your 2nd place medal next time, and I'll swap with you. 3 points separated Gary and Fran for 2nd and 3rd, respectively. Across the board high scores for non-distinguished shooter went to Bruce Fockler. Bruce earned a whopping 7 points, which puts him at 22, and earned him his CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman certificate for 2014. Congratulations, Bruce!

In the Bolt Action Match: For the first time in recorded history, Gary Baldwin had a math error, cheating himself out of 2 points. Again, Fran came to the rescue and fixed his score. But the extra 2 points was still not enough to catch Gary Thorson who shot 365-4X for the win.

Rod McDonald shot his new Tavor .223 Bullpup throughout the day, just for the fun of it. And it appears he had A LOT of fun, scoring 361-3X in the M1 match, 332 in the Bolt match, and taking the pot in the Sniper Challenge. All with one of those short, funny looking pieces from Israel. The Tavor is what my wife might call "*cute*". But it's a shooter!

By the way: Starting at the next match on Aug. 24, we're going to change up the Sniper Challenge a little bit. We will still do the 3 shots prone at the 6-inch gong at 200 yards. But then, we'll have an 8-inch gong at 100 yards. Instead of 1 shot sitting, you'll take 1 shot *unsupported* kneeling, at the 8-inch gong at 100. Then you'll take your last shot *unsupported* standing, at the 8-inch gong at 100 yards. (I told you I would change things up just to *Sniper Challenge* you – just wait 'til you see what I come up with next!). Sud-den death tie breakers will be unsupported standing at the 6-inch gong at 200.

August 2014 Old West Centerfires. "The Northern Herd Returns"

The "Sharps shooters" gathered at the Black Powder Range on August 2nd to competitively "get a stand" and continue accumulating scores towards the seasonal aggregate. Targets for the day were "bufflers," the single bullseye buffalo at 100 yards and the double bullseye buffalo at 50 yards. The 20 rounds course of fire included five rounds at each of the 50 yard double bullseyes and ten rounds at the 100 yard single bullseye. Will Ulry's shooting-station numbers were available but the range master confused Will who selected No. 3. even though his registered shooter number for the day was "2" It all worked out as no crossfire shots occurred.

Both Allen Cunniff and Mike Nesbitt were shooting with new rifles; an 1874 Sharps in .45/70 by C. Sharps Arms for Allen and Mike did his shooting with a new 1885 Highwall in .40/70I, also by C. Sharps Arms. Allen shot his new rifle rather well, being knocked out of 1st place by Bob DeLisle with only 1 point difference between them. Mike shot his 100 yard target first and had a nice group a bit low and to the right, forfeiting some points that might otherwise have increased his score.

ReliableTony was on hand to keep the coffee pot filled and assisted with scoring and posting. Weather was essentially benevolent.

Aggregate prizes for all places were provided by C. Sharps Arms through Mike Nesbitt plus a donation from Allen Cunniff. Those prizes included a variety of Sharps-themed prints. Scores were corrected after award of Sharps prizes and Allen's score is correctly in 2nd place.

Shooter's meeting topics were possible changes for next year's series: expanding to 6 or more matches with more matches held on Hi Power range and introducing offhand shots at some shorter ranges will be considered. There is a need for a heavier gong target for 100 yards however present 50 & 75 yard turkeys seem adequately heavy bullet resistant. Opening BP range to general shooting involving Blackpowder Centerfires was discussed but not advanced. Options exist for additional OWCF events if scheduled and supervised. Next OWCF match is on Saturday.September 6th on the Black Powder Range. A relay type offhand shoot at the 50 & 75 yard turkeys will be tried as an experiment. Course of fire will be 20 rounds on paper and possibly 5 more offhand.

Regarding scheduled range work for Sunday August 17th, work will focus on trial clearing with possible Scout assistance on the knife & hawk trail. Anticipate lots of understory growth and need for a couple of working heavy duty weed whackers. Start time will be 9:00 AM.

<u>MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES</u> Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.
