### **CCRP** Shooter Wins National Championship By Jeff Young

A longtime Capitol City Rifle and Pistol club shooter has gained national recognition by winning one of the U.S. national championship's toughest rifle events. Dan Lowe, who shot with the Capitol City Juniors rifle team since age 12, took first place and set a new national record in the 2014 National Outdoor Smallbore Rifle Championship's Metric Position Rifle match.

Lowe's face is familiar to western Washington shooters who follow high school and juniors smallbore rifle competition. In addition to competing for four years with the Black Hills High School rifle team, he also shot .22 and air rifle with coach John Crossman's Capitol City Juniors. Crossman's group and two area high school rifle teams train at CCRP's 50-foot indoor range.

After high school, Lowe helped coach the Black Hills Team and joined the U.S. Army last year. In basic training he set a new military rifle record for Fort Jackson trainees.

After advanced Army training, he was invited by the Army Marksmanship Unit (AMU) to compete with several other shooters for a spot on their team. Lowe's debut was impressive; he beat several of the Army's top shooters - many of whom are veterans of national and international competition.

Lowe shot at this year's "nationals" as an AMU member. His winning and record-setting performance validated what Army and the USA Shooting officials have known for the past few years: Lowe could medal on the international shooting circuit.

While Lowe's performance at the U.S. national matches is a standout honor, it also represents the guality of shooters produced by the Cap City Juniors. Crossman's youngsters consistently gain national

recognition in individual and team competition. Many of his young athletes are picked up by college rifle teams. Their coach also has an enviable record of helping them win college academic and shooting scholarships.

Many of us know the names and accomplishments of America's top shooters. But CCRP members have a unique opportunity to meet tomorrow's champions. On weekday evenings, the indoor range is packed with eager young shooters. The rifle fire you hear is the sound of our sport's future.

# September 2014 Old West Centerfires 2014 Season Finale

The last remnant of "Sharps shooters" gathered at the Black Powder Range on September 6th to competitively 'get a stand' and conclude accumulating scores towards the seasonal aggregate. Doug Simpson and Kent Dunn were back on the present list, Kent to observe, Doug to aggravate the bargain hunters with his recently acquired Taylor's 45-70 Sharps. Dave Dolliver and Doug Simpson managed the scoring, Bill Wirtaanen was also a range visitor. Reliable Tony Yaklich was on hand to keep the coffee pot filled.

Order of fire was 50 yards, 10 rounds fired from a sitting position over cross-sticks, double-bullseye buffalo with 5 rounds scoring on each bullseye. Two additional shots were fired offhand at the 50 yard steel hanging turkey. At 100 yards we fired 10 rounds sitting over cross-sticks at a regulation "200 yard" bullseye target plus another two rounds fired offhand at the 75 yard hanging steel turkey. Those added offhand shots were scored at 10 points per hit and they are indicated with "X's" or "O's" for misses after the paper target scores in the listing below.

We might also note that while only four shooters felt competitive enough to join in the fun for this final shoot of the year, all four of them used rifles from C. Sharps Arms. And those rifles were all 1874 Models except for Mike Nesbitt's Model 1885 Highwall in .40/70 SS caliber. However, for his offhand shooting, Mike put the Highwall down and used his faithful Model 1874 by C. Sharps chambered for the .50/70 cartridge.

Another .50/70, the one belonging to John Weger, did an outstanding job because John had the highest score by one point on the 100 yard targets.

Just before the awards were presented we had a shooter's meeting where a discussion was held about what to do for next year. Everyone agreed that we should do more shooting. In response to that, next year we will hold six matches, three on the 200 yard range and the other three on the 100 yard black powder range. More offhand shooting will be included. The yearly aggregate scoring will include the best five daily scores for each shooter, which will allow a shooter to miss one of the shoots and still be competitive for the yearly or seasonal awards. Offhand shots at our shorter ranges can be continued with the thicker silhouette targets for 100 yards. Inspection of the 50 & 75 yard silhouette targets showed no damage attributed to the black powder "buffalo guns." It was all in fun and we certainly all had fun!!

Reminder of upcoming events: Next Sunday Evergreen monthly match. All rifles on the range followed by Range prep for Fall Harvest starting on September 18<sup>th</sup>. Muzzle loading matches at CCRP will resume on Saturday October 4<sup>th</sup> with a combination of 10 shots on range and 10 shots on the trail, rifles only.

### Indoor Air Gun Matches at CCR&P Start in October

There are two types of indoor air rifle matches at CCR&P.

There is Air Rifle Benchrest which is shot from a bench rest at targets 50 feet away. The course of fire is four targets of 25 record shots. Time for each target is 20 minutes. Match is a total of 100 record shots plus any sighters. Shooters compete in two classes; Air rifles that are spring powered (SPR) or by compressed air [precharged pneumatic (PCP) which includes single stroke pneumatic (SSP)].

The other Air Rifle match is a Field Target match which is also shot indoors at 50 feet. The targets are similar to silhouette shooting but have a hole varying in size in which the shooter has to shoot through to trigger a lever the causes the silhouette to fall down. The match is 40 shots for score. The shooters shoot twice at 20 targets. There are two classes; Field Target which is shot from a sitting position and Hunter Field Target where the shooter can use support sticks/cross sticks and sit on a stool.

These events are designed to give air rifle shooters the opportunity to test both the accuracy of their equipment and their individual skills in a friendly, competitive atmosphere away from the outside weather conditions. These events are generally held once a month on Saturdays from October through March. Check the Club's calendar and come on out and give it a try. ### Indoor .22 cal Pistol League Starts in October

On Monday October 6, 2014 the .22 cal Fall Indoor Bullseye Pistol League will start. The shooting is from 50 feet, one handed with a semi-auto or revolver in .22 cal. LR with open sights or optics, no lasers. The League is on Monday nights and runs eleven weeks with shooters submitting 10 scores to complete the league. Each score consists of firing 60 shots. Twenty shots each in slow fire, timed fire and rapid fire. There are relays at 6:30 and 7:30 p.m. Shooters can submit one or two scores each night.

Shooters can also pay the fee and shoot for fun, one or two handed.

#### <u>MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES</u> Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
