Sunshine and Shadows

A fine day it was; for gardening, walks in the park, or working on your tan. But bright sunshine coming right up range from behind the targets put all targets deeply in the shadows making our May muzzleloading match just a bit challenging. Nine Free Trappers arrived early on the first Saturday in May to share a cup of Reliable Tony's hot coffee and enjoy an otherwise salutary shooting day. This match was for rifles only with one paper target (the double-bullseve buffalo) for ten shots at 50 yards plus the first ten shots on the trail walk and the trail walk tiebreaker. For novelty several of the trappers posted their paper targets reversed and shot at the apparent locations of the bullseyes revealed slightly by the sun coming thru the paper. We really didn't compare their scores but shooting at the backs of the targets sure didn't hurt them. After a brief shooter's meeting the range phase was fired. A break was taken for scoring the paper targets with assistance from Tom Brown. Then the group divided into two parties to 'hit the trail' with suitable safety closure of the black powder paper range. The trail was unexpectedly difficult while shooting into the sun even after the respective targets were located. New spring foliage served as natural camouflage and simply seeing the bullet impacts on the steel targets was a challenge. Persistence saved the day, however, and the trail phase moved to conclusion with lots of comments about the detection and sighting issues.

Returning to the black powder paper range and accumulating the scores determined the aggregate scores for the day. Shoot prizes provided by the club to the top three shooters. Aggregate placing were; 1st-Doug Simpson, 2nd-Tim Sampson, 3rd-Ralph Birmingham, 4th-DeWayne Pritchett, 5th-Dave Perry, 6th-Mike Nesbitt, 7th-Bob Gietz, 8th-Jeff Ritter and 9th-Scott Isom. This concludes Muzzle Loading match until after the rendezvous season, when monthly muzzleloading matches will resume on October 3rd. June's activities include the Old West Centerfires Match (June 6th on the High Power Range) and Oregon Trail Days in Tenino (July 23rd thru 26th with black powder shooting on July 25th & 26th). Work day for Trail Clearing and Repair is scheduled for the third Saturday in August, which is August 15th.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
