MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

When the tough go hunting the Free Trappers shoot the trail October 2015 Monthly

A small contingent of the Free Trappers, only five of us, came to the range for our regular October Monthly Match. With some discussion, range privileges were extended to a visiting shooter from the centerfire venue. All of this was in the interest of taking advantage of the fine sunny morning to have a reasonable match. Such a fine sunny morning may have been a good meteorological description but for those of us attempting to locate our rifle sights and/or targets the description was definitely different. Our guest shooter, Sam Snelson, was included in the match because we felt that having to shoot his big 1874 Sharps .45-100 offhand was a sufficient handicap to make the completion fairly even. A short shooters meeting was held prior to the match and no Free Trappers Meeting was held in the absence of both the Rain-Dee-Voo Booshway and Segundo.

Course of fire was ten shots on the double-bull buffalo target at the 50 yard range followed by ten shots plus tie breaker on the Rendezvous trail. In essaying this combination, visitor Sam expressed some concern over unknown ranges making his precisely adjustable sights more of a hindrance than a help. That proved to be an unwarranted concern when the final results were determined. Interestingly raw rifle scores for the three top shooters were identical, 67's for the buffalo target. Aggregate results were determined for the combination of Target, range and primitive points allowance. Aggregate prizes were provided in brown bag fashion by the Free Trappers. Results in order were: 1st Don Kerr, 2nd Sam Snelson, 3nd Mike Nesbitt, 4th Ralph Birmingham and 5th Bob Gietz.

A word of reminder: the November match on Saturday, November 7th, will be the annual Free Trappers turkey shoot with all three arms (rifle, pistol and trade gun) in play. Match fee basic will be \$16.00 with optional additional novelty targets: turkey head, mystery card and Mulligan's squash for a possible additional chance for a scoring shot. Turkey-form prizes for all matches and the aggregate awards will be furnished by the Free Trappers.
