May 2016 Muzzle Loading Match Report Sunshine and Shadows

Another fine day on the Black Powder range, where the grass was freshly mowed. After shooting the ten shots on paper targets we moved to the "Rain-de-voo" trail and found out what a wild horticultural spring we've had. Some ferns over 75 inches tall. We used Frank Ponceroff for a measure and he's 6'-3" but couldn't be seen. Ten Free Trappers arrived early that day to enjoy an otherwise salutary shooting match if you don't count bright sunlight on the sights. This match was for rifles only with one paper target (the 50 yard double bull) for ten shots offhand at 50 yards and then we used the first ten rifle targets on the trail walk plus the trail walk tie-breaker. Just for the fun of it, several trappers posted their paper targets reversed and shot at the apparent location of the bulleyes revealed by the sun coming thru the paper. After a brief shooters' meeting the paper target was shot at. A break was then taken for scoring those paper targets with assistance from Dave Dolliver and then the group divided into two parties to shoot on the trail with suitable safety closure of the range proper. The trail was unexpectedly difficult even after the respective targets were located in the new spring foliage and residual target impacts making target visibility questionable. Persistence saved the day and the match moved to conclusion with lots of comments about target detection and sighting issues.

Returning to the black powder range and accumulating the scores determined the day's scores for the prizes which were provided by the club. Aggregate placings were; 1st Bob DeLisle, 2nd Don Kerr, 3rd Adam Sampson, 4th Frank Ponceroff, 5th Dave Perry, 6th DeWayne Pritchett, 7th Bob Gietz, 8th Tim Sampson, 9thRalph Birmingham and 10th Clarence Atchison. This was the concluding Muzzle Loader match until after the summer's rendezvous season, when matches will resume on October 1st. June's activities will be Old West Centerfires on June 4th held on the Black Powder Range. In July we have the Oregon Trail Days in Tenino, July 22nd thru 24th with Black Powder shooting in the city park on July 23rd & 24th. Work day for Trail Clearing and repair is scheduled for the third Saturday in September, September 17th.

- Treasurer's report given by Doug S. Motion to approve Treasurer's report as read by Larry L. Seconded by Richard S.
 Board vote: all "aye"
- Jeff Y. asked where the capitol fund gets its money. Are Dues and assessments line item separated? Where is each item designated to go?
- March meeting minutes read. Changes recommended. Terry M. motioned to approve March meeting minutes. Larry L. seconded. Board vote: all "aye".
- Chris M. motioned to approve the appointment of Ray Crisp as Vice President of CCRP and Bob Jamison to back fill Ray's duties at the Capitol City Bowmen for the remainder of 2016 (December 31, 2016). Other web sites created by this contractor discussed. Options discussed. Verified Bob Euliss would be the webmaster, and there would be others with admin rights. Other bids are due from different contractors, but were not available at meeting time.
- Irene H. is collecting pictures to post on the new site and would like more. Jeff Y. agreed to provide others.
- By Laws review: Richard S. provided latest proposals/updates and explained color coding system. Discussion about definition of family member, life member, which member is the voting member. It was pointed out that in the New Member Orientation there are no family members mentioned, only individual members. See John Mullhall. Age limit discussed.
 Recommend 21 years old age limit to align with insurance coverage.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
