August 6, 2016 Old West Centerfires

The penultimate match of the 2016 Old West Centerfires season saw seven participants present at the CCRP High Power Range. Weather was mild and breezy for a summer day and hot coffee available through the offices of Reliable Tony was quite welcome. Course of fire was total 20 rounds, 10-shots at each range of 100 and 200 yards. The target used at the 100 yard line was the standard 100-yard Muzzle-loading rifle target (with the black covering the 7-ring) and at 200 yards we used the modified Military 200-yard bullseye. These are the same targets that we have been using previously at these distances in this black powder centerfire league. There was one new shooter joining the group: J.R. Ritter, Jeff Ritter's son. And Jerry Mayo was with us for his second match, his first match while using his own rifle. Both enjoyed the match at least as much as the rest of us and they have every intent of participating in the future matches while moving up on the scoring scale. Dave Dolliver scored and assisted in posting scores. Bob DeLisle volunteered his truck to assist in posting targets at the 100 yard range. Participants, equipment and scores, in order of score are:

Our next OWCF at CCRP will be held on September 3rd, 2016 on the Black Powder range again and reminders will be sent. Targets will be the double-bullseye buffalo at 50 yards and the 100 yard ML Bullseye at 100 yards. That match will conclude the 2016 season's competition and awards for the season aggregate will be awarded in addition to prizes for that match. For this season's finally we can expect a rather good turnout.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

The doin's at Tenino was again the site for the WSMA Formal Rifle Championships and this year

things were just a bit different. That's because Adam Sampson was the booshway and all of the shooters think he did a very good job. There will be few changes noticed in the scores due to his leadership, but a couple changes are there. Two examples of those changes; the rather unpopular 'hawk & knife match and the stake shoot were both dropped. This was the 39th year for these blackpowder matches, held at the Tenino City Park in conjunction with the town's Oregon Trail Days. Once again, the "formal" part about these matches is based on the fact that this competition is all on paper targets for score and the rifle shooting done here is what makes up the WSMA Rifle Championships.

There are other matches held along with the rifle competition, such as a Trade Gun Match and a Pistol Match as well as some one-shot novelty rifle match-

es which are not part of the championships or the rifle aggregate. Those "other matches" are certainly a good part of these doin's at Tenino.

There is also a Ladies' Match and special matches for the young ones which are not part of the main aggregate. Those other shoots make the Tenino shoots more of a good doin's for the whole family and

they certainly add to the fun.

Again, Tom Brown was the range-master and he's a good one. All of the shooters will agree that the time limit of 20 minutes per match is a good idea and most of us had no problems at all in getting off five shots in that

length of time. Tom also does a very good job of explaining each target, for each match, so that every shooter has a clear understanding of how the match will be shot, from what distance and what shooting position.

Mike Moran joined us a bit late for any aggregate shooting but he did make some good shots on Sunday in the Trade Gun Match and in the Pistol Match. His pistol shots, with that new flintlock .54, were good enough to put him in 3rd place, winning a certificate. The Trade Gun Match is always a

In addition to the aggregate prizes "off of the blanket" which all shooters receive (if they participate in the aggregate), shooters were awarded WSMA medals for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd in the rifle events, and with certificates in the nonaggregate (non-WSMA) matches.

The aggregate winner this year was JoJo McWhinney and he also won the pistol match. JoJo picked a custom Bowie
