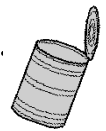

June 2017 Old West Centerfires Match Report

A clear mild Morning

Nine shooters were physically present for this fourth match of the Season. A tenth shooter, Allen Cunniff, shot his witness target ahead and secured his scores for the aggregate. The weather was true to the forecast with mild temperatures and partly cloudy without even so much as a breeze. The shooters who experienced "wind drift" on their targets will have to look for sight looseness or other discrepancies to account for their off-center hits. Coffee was available with moderate demand and we give thanks to Dave Dolliver for compiling the scores.

Jeff Ritter and his son J. R. wound up sharing a rifle for the last portion of the match when a sticky 'fly' in the action of J. R.'s High Wall impeded the hammer fall and couldn't be cleared with the resources at hand. J. R. wound up shooting .45-70 loads in Jeff's .45-90 with some apparent sacrifice in accuracy and sight setting.

Match prizes were awarded with selection for a combination of club-provided meat prizes, C Sharps Arms' generous offering of merchandise items and a new prize donated by SPG, the famous maker of bullet lube for black powder use. Jeff Ritter came out as top shooter with his Remington rolling block .45-90. He just (186-3X) edged Allen Cunniff into second place with Allen's absentee scored 182-4X. Interestingly, according to the witnesses, Allen fired a third "practice target" which, if it had been his initial scoring 100 yard target, would have moved him ahead and into the lead. Jim Dickerman, in third place fired the 2nd best target of the match, a 96-2X at 200 yards and beaten only by Allen Cunniff's 200 yard target with one more X. By virtue of his 2X, Jim broke a tie by having the better score at greater range over Don Kerr who was shooting his C. Sharps Arms '74 Hartford target model in .45/90. Don was awarded 4th place and it's really good to see him back in among the top five as he recuperates. Mike Nesbitt used his loud C. Sharps Arms rifle in .44-90, the big thunder in the range for today, and wound up in 5th place. Just 4 points further down in score came Bob Delisle (6th place) who used his Peder-soli .45-70 for a score of 172. Seventh place went to Jerry Mayo shooting his C. Sharps Arms '74 in .45-70 with paper patched bullets. Eighth place was taken by Phil Wiebe who was joining the "buffalo shooters" for the third time with his C. Sharps Arms Model 1875 in .45-70. Ninth place went to J.R. Ritter handicapped by already mentioned sharing of the rifle with his father, Jeff. Tenth place was won by Will Ulry with his Shiloh Sharps in .45-70.

In the shooters meeting preceding the smoke and the gunfire, coming High Power Range developments were discussed with but progress is suspended probably due to permit review by Thurston County. No prediction is available as to construction schedule. The contactor has been given notice to proceed awaiting only the permit completion to begin work. Also a modified course of fire was discussed with an optional 5-shot target for the 50 yard range to be shot offhand. This may have a trial run for experience with adoption only after the current series is completed in September to maintain integrity of the cumulative scores. We have had a four very good matches for 2017 and if this is any indication, we'll have a very good year with our Old West Centerfires matches. The next Old West Centerfires match, to be shot at 100 & 200 yards again, will be in August on the High Power Range

High Power Shooters

It was a beautiful day in the neighborhood for the May Service Rifle match. We had 8 shooters on the line, and 1 deer at about 50 yards.

Rick Baldwin was the match winner today shooting 452-8X out of a possible 500 with an AR-15.

2nd place went to Gary Thorson shooting an AR-15 for a score of 435-4X

3rd went to Tom Schuettke shooting an AR-15 for 424.8X

Attached is the score sheet.

The Sniper Challenge was "getting real" with the gongs painted in an olive drab and gray camouflage pattern, and some tall grass partially obscuring the 100 yard gong. Perfect sniper conditions (said the devious Match Director).

Gary Thorson and Ken Horton tied with 4 hits each, and went into a sudden death shoot off. The shoot off was a "supported standing" shot on the 6 inch gong at 200 yards. Ken hit for the win, and Gary missed.

Tom Schuettke and Rick Baldwin each had 3 hits. Gary Baldwin had 2 hits.

Finally, we had 5 shooters stay for the Carbine Match. We used the old "5V" targets at 50 yards. Hits in the black counted as 1 point, hits in the white were 0. The course of fire was 5 shots standing, 5 shots kneeling, then 10 shots prone, all in 1 minute. We ran the course twice for a total of 40 rounds - or 40 possible points.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.
