2017 CCR&P High Power Rifle Champions

Each year CCR&P holds a total of 18 high power rifle matches. These include 6 Service Rifle matches, 6 Old Soldier rifle matches, and 6 M1 Garand rifle matches. This year, due to cold, snow, and Christmas Eve, we only held 5 Old Soldier rifle matches.

Shooters who participate in at least 5 of the 6 matches qualify for the Season Championship awards. Those who shoot in all 6 matches have their lowest score thrown out, keeping the highest 5. And in the case of the Old Soldier match this year, we kept the highest 4 out of 5.

Each season champion will receive an engraved medal with their name, match placing, and score. Also, the 1st through 3rd champions will have their names and scores engraved on the trophy in the club house.

Each year we also have our annual CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman award program. Each shooter that places in a high power rifle match earns points. The number of points awarded are based on the number of participants in each match. For a match with 10 or more shooters, points are awarded to those who place 1st through 5th. Also, each stage high score will earn 1 point. When a shooter accumulates 20 points for the year, they earn a certificate designating them a CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman for the year.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
