Indoor Air Gun Matches at CCR&P Start in October

There are two types of indoor air rifle matches at CCR&P.

There is Air Rifle Benchrest which is shot from a bench rest at targets 50 feet away. The course of fire is four targets of 25 record shots. Time for each target is 20 minutes. Match is a total of 100 record shots plus any sighters. Shooters compete in two classes; Air rifles that are spring powered (SPR) or by compressed air [precharged pneumatic (PCP) which includes single stroke pneumatic (SSP)].

The other Air Rifle match is a Field Target match which is also shot indoors at 50 feet. The targets are similar to silhouette shooting but have a hole varying in size in which the shooter has to shoot through to trigger a lever the causes the silhouette to fall down. The match is 40 shots for score. The shooters shoot twice at 20 targets. There are two classes; Open Field Target which is shot from a sitting position and Hunter Field Target where the shooter can use support sticks/cross sticks and sit on a stool.

These events are designed to give air rifle shooters the opportunity to test both the accuracy of their equipment and their individual skills in a friendly, competitive atmosphere away from the outside weather conditions. These events are generally held once a month on Saturdays from October through March. Check the Club's calendar and come on out and give it a try. OLD WEST CENTERFIRES

For this first Saturday in September we had twelve shooters which is a record for one or our Old West Centerfire matches. The allure of the annual aggregate awards might be partly to blame for such attendance. And this was a very good match with some interesting outcomes.

Now for a rundown on our shooting for this Old West Centerfires match, which started on a rather dark morning with some very light rain. No one made it into the 90s on the 100 yard target.

Loco Jeff Ritter was our top shooter and that is certainly no surprise. His rolling block Remington barreled for .45/90 served him well today for a total score of 182-2X. Jeff's score of 87 at 100 yards was not exceeded (although tied with Don Kerr) and his 95XX at 200 yards was also the top target at that range. That gave Loco Jeff the high scoring targets at both distances.

Allen Cunniff was second for the day with a total score of 182. He usually does very well and once again he was shooting his favorite '74 Sharps Sporting Rifle from C. Sharps Arms in .45/70 caliber. We've learned to expect high scores from Allen.

In 3rd place for this match was Don Kerr, continuing his comeback to the world of good Sharps shooting. Don used his C. Sharps Arms Hartford Target Rifle in .45/90 to shoot an 87 at 100 yards followed by a 90-X at 200 yards for a total score of 177-X.

Fourth place went to Wes Davis who is advancing his friendship with his rather new C. Sharps Arms Hartford Target Rifle in .45/70. It is very good to see Wes's scores climbing and, as I understand it, some of the improvements we can see are rooted in his choice of bullets and some loading techniques. Wes posted a total of 170 which breaks down to an 80 at 100 yards and a 90 out at 200 yards.

Bob DeLisle placed 5th this time, a 169-2X total from an 80-X at 100 and a 89-X at 200. Still shooting paper patched bullets through his Pedersoli .45/70. Now he's using the Postell style bullets from the Steve Brooks mold he bought from Steve on the Vendors' Row at Quigley.

Bob was followed in score in 6th place by Mike Nesbitt who seemed to have a bit of "drifting problem with his herd," getting a 74 at 100 yards combined with a 91-X at 200 for a total 165-X. Mike was shooting his heavy .44/77, "Hefty Hannah," with 410 grain bullets from a Brooks mold over 73 grains of Olde Eynsford 1 1/2F powder. And, like many of the shooters today, Mike didn't display his usual shooting skill on the 100 yard target. Light was hazy/calm today which had others reporting on target visibility problems.

In 7th place, Jeff R. Ritter (the younger) was shooting the Sharps in .40/65 and doing very well at with a score 100 yards of 79-X, and an 82 out at 200 yards, totaling 161-X.

A very welcome returning visitor, Mike Moran shot with us for the first time this year and place 8th while using a C. Sharps Arms '74 in .40/70 bottleneck, claiming a 75 at 100 yards and an 85-X at 200.

Another repeat visitor, Ed Lagergren fought his way to 9th place with a 100-yard target showing only 62 but a very good 200 yard target boasting a 94-3X, totaling a 156-3X. Ed fired two misses at 100 yards before noticing the windage adjustment was loose and had moved all the way to the right. Following Ed, in 10th place, posting a 69 at 100-yards and an 86 at 200 yards was Jerry Mayo, getting a total of 155 for the day with his 1874 C. Sharps Arms '74 Hartford in .45/70. Jerry was playing with two different bullet styles, trying to decide which he prefers, and that might have "helped" him drop down lower than his usual placement.

Jerry was followed by Phil Wiebe in 11th place with his 1875 Sharps in .45/70, shooting scores of 57 at 100 yards and an 80 out at 200 yards, totaling 137. Clarence Atchison, shooting his still somewhat unfamiliar C. Sharps Arms Bridgeport in .45/70, getting a 37 at 100 yards and a 34 at 200 yards for a total of 71. Clarence seemed to encounter a drift which carried too many shots off target

The after-aggregate gong match provided some tight competition for the eight who ponied up to participate. At the usual conclusion 3 shooters, Wes Davis, Mike Nesbitt and Mike Moran all had identical scores of 8 hits, with 5 hits at 200 yards and 3 offhand hits at 100 yards. In order to break the tie, they shot just one more round at the offhand "bucket" target. Mike Moran made a good hit while Mike Nesbitt and Wes Davis both missed their shots. That left Mike as undisputed winner of the cash prize. That may be an incentive to bring him back.

After awarding prizes in the order noted above for the day's results, the statisticians took over to compile the year's top shooters. This is based on the top 5 match scores with the lower score thrown out for those who had 6 completed matches. The order of shooters with the top accumulated best 5 scores were; (1st) Allen Cunniff 937-10X, (2nd) Loco Jeff Ritter 907-5X, (3rd) Bob DeLisle 897-9X, (4th) Mike Nesbitt 891-10X, (5th) Don Kerr 880-7X, (6th) Jerry Mayo 846-X, (7th) Wes Davis 653, (8th) Phil Wiebe 547-X (9th) Jeff Ritter 472-2X, (10th) Clarence Atchison 291-X, (11th) Mike Moran 160-X and (12th) Ed Lagergren 156-3X. Even though Mike Moran and Ed Lagergren had only participated in this one match, they still received aggregate prizes. Let's hope next year they'll have more scores to add up...

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
