November Old Soldier Match

Kevin Neubert had a good day for the November Old Soldier Match, winning both the Old Soldier Match and the .22 Rapid Fire Silhouette match. Kevin borrowed Tom Schuettke's Model 03-A3 rifle and did very well shooting a score of 282-2X out of a possible 300.

Tom and Gary Thorson were both shooting their Model of 1917 rifles, and both have a little work to do adjusting the sights. Tom's rifle was shooting high, and Gary's was shooting low and a little left. Adjusting the sights on a Model 1917 is no easy task. Windage is only adjustable by drifting the front sight over. The rear sight has a folding ladder with an aperture for adjusting long range elevation, but most people prefer to use the "battle aperture" out to about 300 yards or so. When using the battle aperture, you can only raise the point of impact by filing down the front sight blade a little bit; but lowering the point of impact requires installing a taller front sight. And it's getting tough for find parts for 101 year old rifles. Good luck, Tom!

We had some pretty good scores with the top 4 shooters being within 12 points of each other. And even Tom was only 22 points below the match winner, even though he had to aim at the bottom of the target stand to get his impacts in the black.

For the December match, we all decided to bring our Model of 1917 rifles. That should be fun.

Do You Want To Be A Better Shooter?

Do you want to improve your rifle shooting skills? Don't like shooting in the dark and the rain? Can't find anything good to watch on TV? Then come join us every Wednesday night at 6:30 PM on the Indoor Range for rifle practice.

We open the Indoor Range up for CCR&P club members from 6:30 to 8:30 PM every Wednesday night until the end of March. This is a semi-formal shooting session. We always have at least one NRA certified Range Safety Officer present to run the session, and the experienced shooters are always happy to help out new shooters improve their techniques. We organize it into four 10-minute sessions, with plenty of time between sessions to change your targets, warm up by the wood stove and have friendly conversation.

We practice shooting in the prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing positions. Or you can shoot the entire session in one position if you choose. You can use any .22 LR rifle, with scope or open sights. The usual course of fire is 10 shots in 10 minutes, using the NRA A-17 target at a distance of 50 feet. Targets are provided for you.

December 2019 Muzzle Loading Match Report

CHRISTMAS CAME EARLY

There were eleven shooters on hand on Saturday, December 7, 2019 for the Puget Sound Free Trappers' Christmas Match at the CCRP Black Powder Range. We had an accumulation of the "usual suspects" with a first-time visitor, Scott Young from around Eatonville. Weather was mild with mist to full-fledged showers intermittently. Conditions improved as the morning went on as well as the shooters' dispositions. The order of fire for this, our third muzzle-loader match of the range season was for the full arsenal of front-stuffers; rifles, pistols, and trade guns with a combination of paper and reactive targets for each as well as clay pigeon flyers for the trade guns which concluded the match. Each category was recognized with prizes for first, second, and third places. Combined rifle and pistol scores determined aggregate placing for the prizes on the blanket.

Helping during this event was Tom Brown who scored, checked, and posted the match results. Set up the previous day was assisted by Mike Nesbitt and Scott Isom. Will Ulry, Rain-Dee-Voo Booshway, was on hand to bring the results of planning meeting up to date and provided details of the Tenino raffle this year featuring a custom made suit of buckskins. There is a remaining need for a Trade Chief, some trail guides and confirmation of cooking capable assistance for the kitchen. The 2020 Rain-Dee-Voo raffle rifle with accessories was on hand to start ticket sales

Both paper targets and reactive gongs were selected to provide a seasonal gift in the large size targets used. The soda can luck shoot had a turkey head as the designated target and the luck shoot award went to our visitor, Scott Young. Awards for the individual rifle, pistol, and trade gun matches were comprised of high protein consumables. Awards: for Trade gun went to; 1st -Mike Nesbitt, 2nd -Bob DeLisle, and 3rd -Dewayne Pritchett, for rifle; 1st - Bob DeLisle, 2nd - Clarence Atchison, and 3rd -Will Ulry, and for pistol; 1st - Mike Nesbitt, 2nd -Will Ulry and 3rd -Clarence Atchison.

This was the annual Christmas Brown Bag Mystery Shoot with aggregate prizes donated by the club for selection from the aggregate blanket. With the prizes "hidden" in the paper bags, the shooters did not know what they were getting when the prizes were selected, in order according to aggregate placement. The aggregate placements were; 1st - Mike Nesbitt (198), 2nd -Will Ulry (196), 3rd - Bob DeLisle (187), 4th - Clarence Atchison (186), 5th -DeWayne Pritchett (129), 6th -Jerry Mayo, 7th -Roy Williams, 8th -Phil Wiebe, 9th - Ralph Birmingham, 10th -Scott Young, and 11th -"Loco" Jeff Ritter.

Coming events: Evergreen Muzzleloaders monthly shoot is next Saturday, December 14th, and it is for rifles or trade guns on both range and trail. The match starts at 09:30, shooting fee \$5.00. The next Free Trappers event will be on the Black Powder Range on Saturday January 4th. The fee will be \$11.00 plus extras. The aggregate blanket will be prized by individual shooter donations. (Bring a blanket prize.) Competition will be for rifles, pistols, and trade guns including flyers. Primitive clothing will be included for bonus points with 5 points awarded for three items, including but not required primitive footwear. Range setup will be the preceding day, Friday January 3rd, starting at 2:00 PM on the Black Powder Range.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
