There were eleven shooters on hand on Saturday, January 4th for the Puget Sound Free Trappers' New Year's Match at the CCRP Black Powder Range. We had a good contingent of visitors from the Eatonville area, hoping to reenergize their muzzle-loading group and feeling their way by joining the CCRP gang at our monthly event. Weather was reasonable for the date and only had intermittent showers up to the conclusion. The order of fire for this, our first muzzle-loader match of the new year, was for the full arsenal of front-stuffers; rifles, pistols, and trade guns with a combination of paper and reactive targets. Flying targets for the trade guns were omitted in the interest of saving time. Each category was recognized with prizes for first, second, and third places and the combined rifle and pistol scores were added up to determine aggregate placement for the good prizes on the blanket.

Helping during this event was Tom Brown who scored, checked, and posted the match results. Set up the previous day was assisted by Tom Brown, Mike Nesbitt and Scott Isom. Will Ulry, our Rain-Dee-Voo Boosway, was on hand to bring the results of planning meeting up to date and provided details of the Tenino raffle this year featuring a custom made suit of buckskins. There is a remaining need for some trail guides and confirmation of cooking capable assistance for the kitchen

The soda can luck shoot had a turkey head as the designated target and the luck shoot award went to Adam Sampson. Awards for the individual rifle, pistol, and trade gun matches were comprised of New Year's celebration items including some "bubbly" (sparkling cider). Start at 09:00 at the trail gate and bring range repair tools. The next Free Trappers event will be on the Black Powder Range on Saturday February 1st. The fee will be \$11.00 plus extras. The aggregate blanket will be prized by individual shooter donations. (Bring a blanket prize.) Competition will be for rifles, pistols, and trade guns including flyers. Primitive clothing will be included for bonus points with 5 points awarded for three items, including but not requiring primitive footwear. The Old Soldier Match is for “standard issue military rifles from any country, World War 2 vintage or older”. This is a 30 round match, fired all slow fire from the prone position at 200 yards, in 2 strings of 15 rounds in 15 minutes each. The target is the NRA standard 200 yard military type target.

We had a pretty exciting finish to this match. The match winner was **Mike Coleman, shooting a Swedish Mauser Model 1896 for a score of 273-3X.**

We had a tie for 2nd place between Gary Baldwin and Gary Thorson, with each shooter having 272-2X. Only 1 point behind the winner. Both Gary’s were shooting a U.S. Rifle Model of 1917.

And, as we were hoping, Gary Baldwin and Rick Baldwin each earned the final points needed to qualify as a CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman for the 2019 Season. Congratulations!

Following the main match, we had the Gong Challenge. And it was major fun having 8 shooters participating!

TYPE OF RIFLES ALLOWED FOR EACH MATCH: Shooters may use *Any Rifle* they choose to shoot any of our High Power Rifle Matches. However, only those shooters using the designated type of rifle for each match will be eligible for match placing and awards. Shooters choosing to use *Any Rifle* shall shoot the same course of fire as is designated for the match.

"Any Rifle" - A rifle with no restrictions on sights or accessories, except that it must be legal and safe to competitors and range personnel. Ammunition will be restricted to no larger than .45 caliber.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
