MISSION STATEMENT

The object of this organization shall be the encouragement of organized rifle, shotgun and pistol shooting among residents of our community, with a view toward better knowledge on the part of citizens of our community of the safe handling and the proper care of firearms, and the development of those characteristics of honesty, good fellowship, self discipline and self reliance that are the essentials of good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism.

High Power Rifle Shooters

On Sunday, May 10, we resumed our high power rifle matches with the M1 Garand Match. We had 7 shooters suffering from cabin fever (but otherwise healthy) show up for the match on a warm 82 degree Sunday. In keeping with current events, the safety briefing started off by reminding everyone to maintain their safe anti-social distancing. After that, we got down to some serious shooting.

Since the 75th anniversary of World War 2 Victory in Europe was on May 8th, it was only fitting that start back up with an M1 Garand Match. We had 5 M1's on the line, an AR-15, and an M1A. I wonder how many of those M1 Garand's were in Europe for the war. If only they could tell their stories.

The match winner was Gary Thorson with a score of 446-5X. Close behind was Ken Horton, who shot an M1A for a score of 440-10X. Ken actually had the high scores in Prone Rapid and Sitting Rapid. But since his M1A was not an original M1 Garand, his score didn't count for placing in the match.

Following the main match we had the gong challenge. The gong challenge consists of two 6-inch gongs at 200 yards, and two 8-inch gongs at 100 yards. Each shooter takes 2 shots at the gongs. We go through the line 3 times in prone position shooting at the 6-inch gongs at 200 yards, then 1 time shooting kneeling at the 8-inch gongs at 100 yards, and 1 time standing at the 8-inch gongs at 100 yards, for a total of 10 shots.

Gary Thorson and Tom Schuettke tied with 9 hits each, so they went into a sudden death shoot off at the 6-inch gongs at 200 yards from the kneeling position. Gary and Tom each missed their first shot, then Tom made the hit on his second shot for the win. Good shooting, Tom!

We finished off the day with the .22 rimfire Rapid Fire Silhouette Match. We set up metal silhouettes at 25, 50, and 75 yards. The silhouettes are alternating colors. Two shooters come to the line at a time, and you shoot down your color silhouettes as fast as you can. Each shooter has 25 targets to hit.

With the State Guidelines regarding what is required for opening under each of the Phases and that Thurston County may be in only Phase 2 by first of June we had concerns on how we would pull off the shoot. As this would limit our club on the numbers members who could attend work parties safely, we were not sure how we could even be ready to put on a shoot. Another consideration was if by July Thurston County was not past Phase 3 requirements which would limit the number of people to a total of 50 to include all staff, visitors, and shooters. With Social Distancing requirements we were not sure how to implement safe Distance Practices on the course with group sizes. Then there was the question is it worth our time, energy, resources, and actually how much money are we going to make with less than 50 shooting.

So you all know CCB did have a plan on if we did the shoot: we would not provide a full Kitchen only snacks water stations, there would be NO Camping, NO Potluck or novelties games. We decided that this is not the shoot we would want to put on.

One more decision by the Board and this was really the first and foremost reason to cancel, is the fact that majority of members who work the shoots are in the High Risk Category due to age and some have health issues. CCB values our members safety and health and this takes precedence over all else. This was unanimous decision by our Board of Directors to cancel the shoot this year.

So we will focus on next year's event. We plan for the 100 3D Shoot to held on July 3rd-4th 2021.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
