M1 Garand Match

We had the June M1 Garand Match this past Sunday. Since there were only 5 of us shooting the match, this will be an abbreviated report.

Match winner was Gary Thorson with a score of 444-2X. Gary was also the high score in Rapid Fire Prone, Rapid Fire Sitting, and Slow Fire Standing. Gary earned 5 distinguished points, which brought his total to 20, and qualified him to be the first CCR&P Distinguished Rifleman for the 2020 season.

2nd Place was Tom Schuettke at 426-4X. Tom was also the high score in Slow Fire Prone. Tom earned 2 distinguished points.

3 shooters participated in the gong challenge.

Tom Schuettke won with 7 hits out of 10 shots.

Gary Baldwin had 5 hits.

Gary Thorson had a bad day with only 4 hits.

Ethan Mohar won the .22 Rapid Fire Silhouette match with the fastest time of 1:11. Good job, Ethan!

A Rare June Morning

For this third OWCF match of our 2020 shooting season we had seven shooters. This could have been referred to as “The Bandit Match” due to the required attire. An early threat of rain drifted away to leave a calm, sunny environment which provided some good shooting conditions. Targets were posted for a single relay trusting that conditions would stay nice, which they did. Shooters started with their range of choice and fired continuously with sight adjustments made as needed. Tom and Josh Brown were on hand as assistants and potential future participants. As an accommodation to the “Phase 2 ‘Covid 19’ requirements; 6 foot social distance was required as well as all participants wearing face coverings.

Scores reflected the optimum shooting conditions with six of our seven shooters scoring at 100 yards 80 or above and with five of the seven at 200 yards scoring 90 or above. The perfect score of 100 on one target proved elusive although Allen Cunniff came close this time, turning in a 97-XXX on his 200 yard target which was the best score for the day. Allen also had the best score at 100 yards, a 93-X.

A rundown of the scores: Allen Cunniff, a 190-4X, our top and most often hard to beat shooter. Loco Jeff Ritter compiled 90 at 100 yards plus a 95-X at 200 yards for a total of 185-X. Jeff’s new C. Sharps Arms 1874 Bridgeport model in .45/90 served him very well today and this was the first match for that rifle. Close behind with a total score of 173-X was Mike Nesbitt with his familiar heavy C. Sharps Arms ’74 in .44/77 taking third place. Jerry Mayo took fourth place, tied with Mike’s score but lost out to Mike who had a higher score (93-X) at 200 yards. Fifth place was grabbed by Bob DeLisle, shooting his .45/70 with paper patched bullets and scoring a total of 172-X for the day with an 82 at 100 yards and a 90-X at 200 yards. Sixth place went to Wes Davis shooting his round barreled C. Sharps Arms 1874 Hartford target model in .45/70, getting an 80-at 100 yards combined with an 88 at 200 yards for a total of 168. Seventh place went to Kent Dunn, shooting his Pedersoli Sharps 1874 in .45/70, scoring 79 at 100 and 81 at 200, combined to make 160 points for the day.

The after-aggregate gong match, with the “octagon” at 200 yards and the “bucket” at 100 yards, provided some competition for the five who ponied up one more dollar to participate. Bob DeLisle swept the competition only missing one shot at the 100 yard offhand stage.

We had a very good morning of black powder cartridge shooting!

May Service Rifle Match

On Sunday, May 14 we held our first CMP/NRA format Service Rifle Match of the year. We had 9 shooters on the line, pleasant weather, and a fun day of shooting.

Dexter Mejia shot the match for the first time, and did pretty good. He has a nice AR-15 rifle and carbine, and I'm sure that with a little more practice he will be posting some very nice scores.

We had 3 old school M1A rifles, and 6 AR-15 rifles on the line. The M1A's were all operated by Vietnam Era Veterans, 2 Marines and a Coast Guardsman. The 2 Marines actually served in Vietnam, while the Coastie went to Florida. (Hey, somebody had to keep an eye on those college kids during spring break).

The Service Rifle Match is a 50 round match, with a maximum possible of 500 points. The course of fire consists of:

Slow fire prone position, 20 rounds in 20 minutes, on an NRA 600 yard reduced target, maximum of 200 points

Rapid fire prone position, 10 rounds in 70 seconds, on an NRA 300 yard reduced target, maximum of 100 points

Rapid fire sitting position, 10 rounds in 60 seconds, on an NRA 200 yard target, maximum of 100 points

Slow fire standing position, 10 rounds in 10 minutes, on an NRA 200 yard target, maximum of 100 points

The high score in slow fire prone was **Tom Schuettke** with a score of **196-6X**

High score in rapid fire prone was **Tom Schuettke** with **92-1X**

High score in rapid fire sitting was **Gary Thorson** with a score of **96-2X**

Tom and **Gary** tied for the high score in slow fire standing with each having a score of **90**

The match winner was **Tom Schuettke**, shooting an AR-15 .223 with 4X scope, with a score of **467-8X**

2nd place was **Gary Thorson**, shooting an M1A .308 with open sights, with a score of **440-5X**

3rd place was **Rick Baldwin**, shooting an AR-15 .223 with 4X scope, with **434-3X**

Following the main match was our gong challenge. Tom Schuettke took the pot with a perfect score of 10 hits out of 10 shots.

Gary Thorson - 9 hits

Rick Baldwin - 7 hits

Ken Horton and Kevin Neubert each had 4 hits

Dexter Mejia - 3 hits

Gary Baldwin - 2 hits

We wrapped up the day with the Carbine Match. For the carbine match, we shoot at a target at 50 yards. Each shooter starts with two 10-round magazines. At the "fire" command, take 5 shots standing, then 5 shots kneeling, then change magazines and take 10 shots prone. Hits in the "black" are 1 point, hits in the "white" are misses.

For this match, we had an even number of shooters, so we did a "team" shoot. We had 3 teams of 2 shooters each. Each team shared one target. Shooters would alternate fire during the match, as follows:

Shooter 1 - standing, Shooter 2 - standing, Shooter 1 - kneeling, Shooter 2 - kneeling, Shooter 1 - prone, Shooter 2 - prone. All firing had to be completed within 60 seconds.

We ran the course 2 times, for a total of 40 rounds for each shooter. (80 rounds per team) We picked 3 team "captains", and had them pick their other shooter.

The match winners were the team of Tom Schuettke and Gary Thorson with 49 hits in the black.

Wood Cutting

22 hardy souls climbed out of bed early the 30 of May for very productive day. Weather was perfect. It even started out with an over the top Light Show. Here tell one bolt of lightning hit a tree near Tenino and started a fire. Beside the 12 Plus chords of wood placed in the wood shed we hand one fine lunch. MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees (taxes are additional)**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
