Wednesday Night Indoor .22 Rifle Instructional League

Do you want to practice and improve your rifle shooting during the cold, dark, rainy winter? Well, we have a deal for you.

Every Wednesday evening at 6:30 PM beginning in October and running through the end of March, we will be opening the Indoor Range for .22 rifle shooting. This will be for CCRP Club Members only. The gate will not be locked open, and you will need your key card to get in. There is no charge for this event, and targets will be provided. When we run out of targets, we'll all chip in to buy some more.

This will be a semi-formal shooting session on the Indoor Range, with targets at 50 feet. NRA certified Range Safety Officers will be present to run the line. We usually run four 10-minute firing sessions, with plenty of time between sessions to change targets, chat with your friends, and warm up next to the wood stove. We typically shoot prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing positions. But you can shoot any position you wish.

You can use any .22 rifle you wish; .22 short, long, or long rifle. No magnums, please. Open sights or scope. If you use a semi-auto rifle, please remember that this is target shooting, so no "Mag-dump blasting" will be allowed.

Starting in January, several of the regular shooters will form a team to participate in the National Rifle League postal league competition. You are welcome to join the team, or if you want to just come and shoot for fun, that's fine.

The course of fire for the league is all slow fire, 10 shots in 10 minutes. We shoot four 10-minute stages; prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing. Scores are submitted online to the league web site. There are usually around 35 teams from all over the U.S. and Canada participating in the league.

Come out and join us. It sure beats watching TV.

Published Notice of an Amendment to the Club Bylaws

This notice will be published for three months in the Plinker and on the club website in accordance with CCRP Bylaws. A vote by the full Board of Directors will follow at the first meeting after the three months.

A clarification is needed in paragraph G of Article IV and is added as the ending sentence of paragraph G as follows:

"Work hours and certifications are to be recorded on the assessment work hours card and the original submitted by the member, completely filled out, with the member's annual dues and proof of NRA membership upon receipt of their annual invoice."

While the assessment deduction for new member recruitment has been in effect for some time now, the decision was never voted into the club Bylaws. The following paragraph is to be placed at the end of paragraph G under Article IV.

"Members may reduce their annual assessment of \$80.00 by recruiting new members who join the club. The reduction is \$40.00 per new member and is limited to two reductions per calendar year. Accordingly, two new members will bring the recruiting member's assessment to a zero balance for that member's calendar year and will be credited to the member's account for the anniversary following the recruiting. Recruiting assessment reductions are applicable only to assessments, will not apply to dues, are not transferable nor do they roll-over to the following year if more than two new members are recruited in one year. The recruiting and proof of the new member's completion of the New Member Orientation can be recorded on the assessment work hours cards, certified by the NMO instructor, the club Training Officer, or a member of the Executive Committee, and then submitted by the recruiting member with their annual dues and proof of NRA membership."

OLD WEST CENTERFIRES

With only two matches left until the end of the Old West Centerfire 2020 season, eight shooters showed for this 6th match of the year in an attempt to elevate that cumulative total. We continue to take the necessary precautions to prevent the spread of Covid-19 virus. Social distancing and appropriate face covering were utilized as dictated by our elected officials. We appreciate and want to thank Mr. Dan Johnson for serving as our Range Safety Officer for the day.

Shooting the black powder cartridge rifle (BPCR) offers us a unique glimpse into the past. Today's shooting is not as utilitarian as in the old days since we now have the modern convenience of retail stores. However, our present shooting elevates this discipline to achieve optimum accuracy. And in this game you have to work for accuracy. I was once told, as it concerns BPCR, any difference makes a difference. This is very true and can be extremely frustrating at times. For example, with all else being equal, different primers can change you bullet velocity as much as 50 feet per second. Weighing bullets is a universally accepted technique for improving accuracy. The author Paul Matthews, speaking of weighing bullets, said it is useless to weigh your bullets if you are not casting premium bullets. An in depth look at "premium bullets" is beyond the scope of this article but the point is relevant to our discussion. You must be able to produce bullets free of voids or not trimmed crooked in a lube sizer or any other fault that would make your bullet not like the others or your weighing is a waste of time. This is certainly not an off the shelf activity. There are hundreds of things that make BPCR a finicky endeavor. And perfect for those who like to tinker with technicalities. Makes you wonder how the old timers did it. Yet success will do what success does. Provide satisfaction by way of results. Be it at 200 yards, 600 or 1000 yards. Satisfaction of a well placed shot makes it all worth it.

Today we started without the blinding, mirage and glare generating sunshine of recent days. A nice soft overcast made for good "seeing" to begin the match. Albeit fleeting as the sun had worn through by the end of the shooting. Scores were generally higher for this match than our last. The match consisted of the usual ten shots at 100 yards, single bullseye target and ten more at 200 yards to a 200 yard single bull target. The 200 yard target provided the higher scores on this day with a top score by Ken Kurfurst at 98-3X!

Allen Cunniff was our number one overall shooter for the day using his 1874 C. Sharps .45/70 to post a total score of 194-9X. Ken Kurfurst achieved nice results from his No. 5 Remington Rolling Block in .45/90, a beauty indeed, and was in 2nd place with an overall 191-3X. Mike Nesbitt came in 3rd with his 1874 C. Sharps Hartford in .44/77 affectionately known as "Hefty Hannah" scoring of 185-2X. Loco Jeff's Sharps did not perform as well as last month but still brought him in at 4th. Jerry came in at 5th with his 1874 C. Sharps .45/70. In 6th with a 172-2X was Curt, shooting a borrowed .50/70. Bob DeLisle and Wes Davis tied with aggregate scores of 157-X and Bob won the tie breaker by having the better score at 200 yards. All scores are as follows:

Our after-aggregate match was once again switched up this month. This time we shot at gongs at 50 and 100 yards and only black powder lever action "camp guns" were allowed. The order of fire was 5 shots at the steel octagon at 100 yards using cross sticks and 5 shots at the Quigley style bucket from 50 yards off hand.

Allen Cunniff had the oldest style lever action represented, an Uberti Henry in 44-40. Wes Davis and Jerry Mayo were shooting The Winchester Rifle (copies of the 1866). This is what the Winchester Model 1866 was commonly referred to as it was the first therefore the only Winchester rifle at the start of its production. Both are Uberti's. Wes shot .45 Colt and Jerry 44-40. Mike Nesbitt shot his Uberti 1873 Winchester sporting rifle with a 30" barrel. Quite a looker. (The rifle that is.) Jeff Ritter had the only original 1873 Winchester on the firing line, chambered in 38-40. Bob DeLisle was shooting his EMF 1892 Winchester in .45 Colt. Many of the rifles were sporting period correct tang sights such as Lyman and Marbles. What a great turnout of old west lever action rifles.

Congratulations to Allen Cunniff for the win by posting an almost perfect score of 9.

September M1 Garand Match

The U.S. Rifle Cal. .30 M1 Garand is quite capable of operating in dense fog and smoke. It has done it thousands of times at places all around the world. But the 3 riflemen who showed up to "hold the line" at the September M1 Garand match quickly discovered that you can't hit what you can't see. 200 yards was not visible. At 100 yards you couldn't see a target. And 50 yards was hazy. The 3 on the line kept waiting for reinforcements, but no one showed up.

After holding for as long as we could, it was time for action. Hoping that conditions might improve, we started off with the .22 rapid fire silhouette match. Even that was difficult as you could barely see the fluorescent orange and green pigs out at 75 yards. But after two times through, the match winner was Tom Schuettke with the fastest time of 1:12 to knock down all 25 targets. 2nd was Gary Thorson with a time of 1:50, and 3rd was Gary Baldwin with 2:54.

Conditions had not improved, and we knew we couldn't press on to 200 yards. "Sniper engagement" of the gongs was impossible as well. We decided that the best we could do was some close quarters shooting. So we set up some of the old, obsolete "5V" 100 yard military targets at 50 yards and ran a 20 round offhand match - 2 strings of 10 shots in 10 minutes each. The old "5V" targets had 5 points assigned to the bullseye, with a V in the center instead of the usual X. A 10 shot string carries a maximum of 50 points, and the maximum total for this match was 100 points. These targets were replaced by the typical "10-X" targets in 1967. So these yellowed and crumbling targets have been around for a while.

DO NOT SHOOT AT ROCKS

We are continuing to see evidence that people are shooting at rocks on the high power range and the pistol bay. Additionally, people are shooting at the large concrete ecology block next to the culvert at the 100 yard line.

THIS PRACTICE IS ABSOLUTELY UNACCEPTABLE!

Shooting at rocks and concrete WILL cause ricochets. We cannot have bullets ricocheting around or potentially leaving the club property.

READ THE RANGE RULES. You may only shoot at targets authorized in the range rules. All bullets **MUST** impact the berms.

Anyone caught shooting at rocks, concrete, or any other unauthorized targets will be brought before the Board of Directors for disciplinary action.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. Membership fees (taxes are additional), collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
