MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

JANUARY 13, 2006

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM

Flag Salute: Will Ulry led the flag salute

Attendance: All directors were present except Shirley Rheault and Jim Greeves

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Darrell Gehlsen reported the following balances; Homestreet \$75,076.70, Certificates of Deposit \$20,000.00 and checking \$3,044.55. Darrell also reported that the club is moving \$10,000 per month into 7 month CD's to take advantage of higher interest rates. He also noted that the re-constructed and actual books from 2005 have been turned over to our CPA. Motion was made and seconded to accept the report. Motion passed.

Membership Report: Darrell reported that the club has 408 members at the present time.

Old Business

<u>CCB / CCRP Agreement:</u> Bill Wright reported on the final draft of the agreement. There was limited discussion on the terms and history of the agreement between the two clubs. Rich Montecucco made a motion to accept the agreement, Ray Crisp seconded. Motion carried. The agreement was signed at the conclusion of the meeting and the lease payment was made for this year.

Indoor Range Door: Will Ulry reported that three companies were contacted and invited to bid on replacing the existing sliding door at the south end of the indoor range. Only two companies responded. Bell and Bell submitted a bid to complete all work necessary to frame, concrete in existing track and install a steel overhead door. Their bid was \$3,200.00. The Garage Door Center submitted a bid to install the door. They did not want to do necessary framing or concrete work. Their bid was \$1,811.00. Rich Montecucco made a motion to accept the Bell and Bell bid, Mike Iyall seconded. Ron Lohman questioned where the money would come from. Darrell answered his question. Motion carried. Discussion followed regarding disposing of the used metal door that was gifted to the club and other scrap steel items around the property. Bob Geitz has offered to pick up and recycle whatever is flagged for disposal. Identification of items that can be picked up should be completed by 1/21/06.

Mega Archery Shoot: Ray Crisp reported on the ongoing negotiations to hold the R100 archery shoot at CCRP on the Memorial Day weekend. He presented copies of the proposed agreement and asked if the club was willing to commit to holding the event. Consensus was that the event would be good for the club. Their was some question pertaining to the litigation clause, but most felt that it was not a deal breaker. Larry Lufkin made a motion to accept the changes in the agreement, Ron Lohman seconded. Motion carried. Bob Geitz, Bill Wright, Steve Andrews, Jim Dotterer, Will Ulry and Bob Parr volunteered to represent CCRP on the planning committee. CCB will have eight members on the committee.

Big Buck and Bull: Will reported that the event is scheduled for Wednesday the 18th. There will be a BB-Q, good stories and scoring of antlers by Bob G. and Will.

New Business

<u>Hank McLeary:</u> Jim D. reported that Hank, the clubs attorney, is moving to Eastern Washington. Jim proposed that Hank be made a Life member in appreciation of all the work he has done for the club. Motion was made, seconded and approved.

<u>Firearms Trauma Kits:</u> Bill Wright reported that the existing range first aid kits were not sufficient to handle a firearms accident. He proposed that the club purchase firearms trauma kits typically used by law enforcement for each range at CCRP. Larry Lufkin indicated that the Hunter Education group would like to purchase two kits as well. Bob Geitz offered to pay for ten kits out of the Black Powder Range monies and the other ranges could reimburse BP for the cost of their kits. The kits sell for \$17.50 with a \$15.00 set up fee by the company. Mike Iyall made a motion to purchase ten kits, Steve Andrews seconded. Motion carried. An ad will be put in the Plinker in case members wish to purchase personal kits.

Handicap Port-a-Pottys: Bill W. reported on the Cowboy Action shoots. He presented a breakdown of the past years income. The group brought in \$4,450.00 to the club over the past year. Bill indicated that with the number of folks participating in their shoots, there is a need for a handicapped equipped port-a-potty on the Action Pistol Range. Discussion followed, indicating that the club should look into having more than one on property. It was determined that decisions about purchasing items such as these would have to be delayed until all range directors had developed budgets for their ranges and event. Apparently not all range directors are completing reports and submitting income as required. It was, however, decided that one or two of the units should be rented for the mega archery event in May.

CCRP Budget Proposal: Darrell will e-mail a copy of the proposed CCRP budget for 2006 to all directors for evaluation and discus-

sion at the February meeting.

Action Pistol Range: Bill W. proposed expanding the Action Pistol Range in order to accommodate the large number of participants in the Cowboy shoots. Larry L. proposed that Ron Lohman chair a committee to do a long range plan for the range. Ron L, Ron Morton, Bill W. and Jim D. will serve on the committee.

<u>Danger Trees:</u> Bob Geitz expressed concern over several trees that pose a potential safety hazard to members using the club and to club assets. Ray Crisp offered to fall three of the trees this weekend, but a timber management plan needs to be completed so that CCRP does not find itself in this situation over and over. Chris will pursue bringing in foresters as discussed in previous meetings.

<u>Bookkeeper Compensation:</u> Bob G. recommended giving Darrell compensation for keeping the clubs books. Darrell indicated that the Board had already approved compensation equal to what we paid the previous bookkeeper and the item is in the proposed budget.

<u>Priority List:</u> Jim D. read the priority list that was developed in 2002. Some of the items have been completed and Jim thought that the Board should develop a new list. No further action was taken.

<u>Insurance Waiver:</u> Jim D. asked for a committee to look at the insurance waiver for CCB. Larry L., Jim D. and Bob Parr will look at the new language and report back.

<u>Club Attorney:</u> With Hank leaving, the club needs to retain a new attorney. Hank has recommended a replacement and the Executive committee will meet with him prior to acceptance of his services.

<u>Request for Exemption:</u> There was one request for exemption of work requirement due to physical disability. Bob G. made a motion to approve, Will U. seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Vacant Board Position:</u> Bob Parr was appointed to fill a vacant position for this year. Ron L. made a motion to accept, Mike I seconded. Motion carried.

<u>Hunter Ed. Storage</u>: Larry L reported that the H.E. safe is full and the group is in need of additional storage space. Larry is proposing that H.E. build a walk in storage similar to the Junior Shooters unit. Hunter Ed would cover all the cost for the construction of the storage area. Location within the clubhouse would be approved by the Board prior to construction.

<u>Wa. Historical Gunmakers Guild:</u> The guild is wanting to construct an 8 x 12 storage facility in close proximity to the clubhouse. They wanted to put the building next to the tractor shed, but after discussion, the Board felt that a location west of the clubhouse would have less impact on events that use areas outside of the clubhouse. Mike Iyall was concerned about cost to the club, Bob stated that the guild would cover all costs. Steve A. noted that the guild should also carry their own insurance. Jim D. made a motion to allow the guild to build, Mike I seconded. Motion carried.

Outside Users: Ron Morton, through Bill Wright, reported that the Chehalis Tribal Police and the U.S. Protective Service have agreed to pay \$10.00 per shooter when they use the club facilities for practice.

Registered Agent: As current Secretary of the Board, Greg Squires will also serve as the Registered Agent for the CCRP Corporation. Ray Crisp made a motion to accept, Bob G. seconded. Motion carried.

Motion to Adjourn: Ray C. made a motion to adjourn at 9:23 PM. Everyone seconded. Motion carried.
