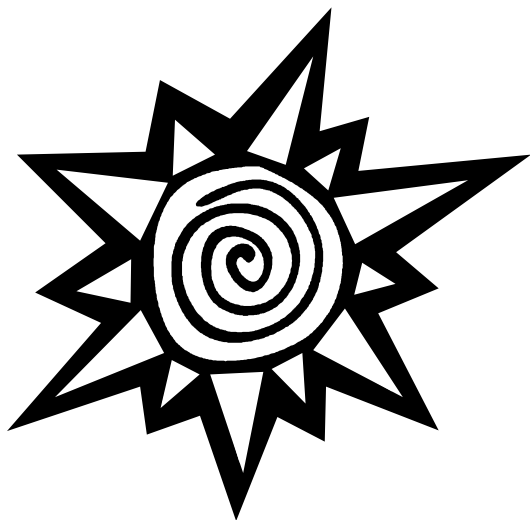

## Calling all .32 Shooters

Mark August 20<sup>th</sup> on your calendar. We'll be celebrating the 100th anniversary of Smith & Wesson's introduction of the SECOND CHANGE to the 32 Hand Ejector Model of 1903 (change three came in '09 and four in '10). Gunfire will be a key element of this celebration and, happily, Gary Baldwin will be hosting our annual, pins-only, center fire-pistol, trophy shoot on this date. As in years past, the .32 shooters will have first go at the nimble targets, preparing them for the heavier opponents they'll be facing later in the day. Should you be interested, pistols for the .32 shoot are limited to those having fixed sights and barrels of four inches or less. Chamberings are .32 ACP, .32 S&W, .32 S&W Long, .32 Short or Long Colt and .32 Colt NP. As this event only requires knock-downs not knock-offs, tiebreakers are common; bring extra ammo. Last year's match went 60 rounds, but all previous years required 72. Spare mags and holsters aren't required (purses optional). Past winners have included Colt 1902, Walther PP & PPK, Rossi M89, S&W Hand Ejector & Regulation Police Models.

**MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES**

*Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003*

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

**CAPITOL CITY RIFLE AND PISTOL CLUB****BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING****June 2, 2006**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM

Flag Salute: Larry Lufkin led the flag salute

Roll Call: Present: Moffitt, Dotterer, Montecucco, Gietz, Greenman, Lohman, Lufkin, Crisp, Ulry, Squires, Baldwin, Parr, Wright, Simpson, Vaughn

Absent: Andrews, Greeves, Morton, Rheault, Gehlsen

Treasurer's Report: Report was deferred as Darryl was not in attendance

Membership Report: Rich Montecucco reported that we had 429 members.

**Old Business**

**Timber Management Plan:** Rick Baldwin and Bob Gietz reported on their meeting with the forester that was hired (Professional Forestry Services, Inc.) to develop a timber management plan for the club. The forester will be back on site on the 15<sup>th</sup> of June and will mark the trees that are marketable, trees that need to be removed due to root rot and trees that need to be removed to facilitate better growth for existing timber. Any timber that range directors would like removed that do not fall into these categories need to be identified prior to the 15<sup>th</sup>. The report that will follow will include an inventory of marketable timber, a timeline for harvesting, inventory of problem trees and trees that should be thinned. The board will have an opportunity to then act on what we want to address given the information provided.

**Non-Profit Classification:** There has been no information received as yet concerning the optimal tax classification for the club. We hope to have information at next month's board meeting.

**Holiday:** Tumwater police have yet to release any of the clubs items that were seized as evidence. Jim Dotterer is working with them and will get possession of items as soon as they are released.

**R-100 Archery Event:** Ray Crisp reported on the recently completed Rinehart match. The event attracted approximately 200 participants and was considered to be a success. Every one was very pleased with the facility and the organization. The only down side was the event was held on a holiday weekend, and also had to compete with two other large events in the Tri-State area. It was overwhelmingly agreed that CCB-CCRP should hold the event again next year.

**Insurance:** Item was deferred until next month.

**New Business**

**First Aid Class:** Ward Andrews, a member, would like to offer first aid and CPR training as his contribution to the work assessment requirement. Bill Wright suggested that as part of the class, Ward should include the showing of the DVD that is part of the new trauma first aid kits and that all match directors should participate in the classes. All present thought that this was an excellent idea and Chris will follow up to get the process started.

**Work Party Weekend:** Scheduled for the last weekend in July. Bob Gietz reported that Dave Nelson will be available both days with his equipment, so if you are a range director and have heavy work that needs to be done, Dave is your man. Bob also reported that he can get 5/8 minus for \$85 / 5 yds. This rock would be used on ranges and around the clubhouse, not on the roads.

**Long Range Plan / Range Development:** Jim D. started the discussion which turned into quite a session. Jim identified three items that need to be seriously considered in the next 1-3 years. Larry Lufkin noted that long range planning should be looking out 10 years and more and that CCRP needs to be involved in an on-going process of looking years into the future. Issues discussed included roof repair, new clubhouse, additional ranges, environmental impacts of growth around the clubs property, developing a program to encourage younger folks to participate in the shooting sports, etc. More will follow on this subject as we begin to flesh out our immediate needs and our longer term needs in order to provide a quality experience for all that use our facility.

**RSO Training:** Will Ulry attended a Rendezvous at the Paul Bunyan club and a member there offered to provide RSO training for our members. Ron Lohman noted that he would like to set up a 2 ½ day session that includes range management under live firing conditions for all participants.

**Bills:** Bob Greenman submitted bills for repairs, gun racks and fuel that he had financed over the past month and asked for reimbursement. He was instructed to submit the bills to Darryl for payment.

**Range Fees:** Ron Lohman asked who was responsible for collecting range fees for matches that are held at CCRP. He noted that there are still match directors that are not submitting reports and/or paying fees in accordance with the Standing Rules. Reports and fees are due within 30 days of the completion of the match. Jim D made a motion to send a registered letter to the director of the small bore silhouette match noting that the match will be suspended due to non-payment of fees. Ron Lohman seconded, motion carried. Discussion followed on how range directors could keep better track of matches and whether the match directors were keeping current on their reports and submittal of fees. Doug S. noted that the board needs to develop procedures to insure that range directors know if match fees are being paid in accordance with the rules. No new policies or procedures were adopted, but will continue to follow this issue.

**Event Forms:** Ron also expressed concern that range directors do not have adequate information on events held on their ranges. Will advised that new event forms will be implemented in 2007. All events will have to re-submit "original" requests. Ron also noted that any change to the original request in a match should require the match director to submit another full event form to the range director and safety officer.

**Motion to Adjourn:** Doug S. made a motion to adjourn at 9:17 PM. Ron L. seconded. Motion carried. The next board meeting is scheduled for July 14, 2006 at 7:00 PM
