MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

January 5, 2007

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM by Chris M.

Flag Salute: Ron Lohman led the flag salute

Attendance: Present: Chris M., Ron L., Ray C., Greg S., Rick B. Excused: Rich M., Larry L.

This meeting was not scheduled on the CCRP calendar. The January BOD meeting is scheduled for January 12, 2007.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Chris reported the following balances; Homestreet \$18,762, Certificates of Deposit \$82,488 and checking \$5,753.

Membership Report: No Report.

Old Business

<u>Lead Abatement Program:</u> Chris reported that Dragon Analytical Lab has tested for lead and copper in impact areas of all ranges. Gene Shearer, a new member with experience in this area, reported that as long as a range is active there are no limit requirements to meet. Only when a range is taken out of service does the issue of heavy metals become an issue. He also shared that in Shelton they are installing hay bales with sand backing up to the target height to make it easier to "mine" the impact zones on a periodic basis. Mining of the impact areas could be an additional revenue source for the club.

<u>Roof Warranty:</u> All work in complete with the exception of the certification by Dura-Last. Apparently the nasty weather we have experienced the last couple of months has slowed the process.

<u>Timber Management:</u> No report

Action Pistol Access: Should have completed information ready for Feb. meeting.

Indoor Range Lighting: A proposal has been put forward to install new lighting in the indoor range. It is believed that the club could realize a rebate of approximately \$3500. There was some discussion as to whether or not the assumptions used to arrive at the rebate amount are valid. Discussion also centered around just how much, if any, money should be spent on upgrading the clubhouse/indoor range. Many felt that we should concentrate on the ranges that produce the lions share of revenue to the club. Most felt that the return on investment in the clubhouse would be minimal, and any project that required inspection by outside entities could create more problems than we could afford to deal with. No action was taken on this item.

New Business

<u>Calendar help:</u> Doug has requested help on keeping the calendar up to date while he is in Iraq. The Board will see to it that any new items that come up will be taken care of in his absence.

<u>Clubhouse Ceiling</u>: Chris talked about the value of putting in a dropped ceiling in the meeting room and in the indoor range area. He felt that a dropped ceiling would help reduce heating bills, improve lighting and make the facility more attractive. Ray discussed ways to improve the lighting in the meeting room area for minimal cost. There was also discussion around how we could generate more revenue from the indoor range. The issues of doing anything that would require us to bring the building up to code would be too expensive to pursue, such as lighting, ventilation, adding extra lanes, etc. Discussion, again, came around to spending money in the areas with the greatest potential for revenue generation. If you have any ideas, please forward them to Chris.

Motion to Adjourn: Ron L. made a motion to adjourn at 8:32 PM. Ray seconded. Motion carried.
