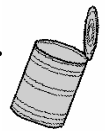




# The Plinker

## Beginner/Intermediate/Advanced Match

The match featured six stations consisting of bowling pins, steel targets, and paper targets. Shooters vied for prizes in three classes. Theresa Dec won the Beginner Class with a score of 66, followed by Ken Horton (54) and Joe Stinton (42). Linda Hildebrandt won the Intermediate Class with a score of 59 followed by Gary Baldwin (51) and Boyd Curry (39). Rick Koglin won the Advanced Class with a score of 52 followed by Tom Eardley (51) and Larry Lufkin (42). Beginners shot from 10 yards and were given unlimited time. Intermediates and Advanced shooters shot from 15 yards and also shot with weak-hand, strong-hand, and both hands. Intermediates were not timed. Advanced shooters were given one minute to complete each stage and started with an unloaded gun. The December match will be held Saturday, December 13th at the Action Pistol Range. Participants need to show up at 8 AM to help set up targets. As with all matches, pre-match orientation is required for all first-time shooters. Also, additional instruction and practice will be provided to any shooter who asks for it.

### **MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES**

***Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003***

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

**(GUESTS:** Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

Olympic Firearms Instruction- More information is needed before we can vote to allow training at CCRP for a fee.

Gate/ Land swap- There has been no response yet. The Lawyer will take further action as needed.

Lead cap- The NRA has joined in the cause in Washington State to protect ammunition.

Director Nominations- Tom Witt was nominated for Black Powder Range director by Bob Gietz.

Centralia Gun Shows, the Future- A motion for CCRP get new displays up to \$700.00 was made by Bob Gietz 2nd by Irene Hertwig. All members voted in favor. A motion to offer \$5.00 coupons to new members that state the location they were obtained was made by Ray Crisp 2nd by Irene Hertwig. All members voted in favor.

Large Event Garbage Charges- There will be no charges for garbage on events that have all participants pay a fee to CCRP.

Logging- The logging is complete and CCRP got paid \$5,436.45 for the logs.

New Business

Burn Permit- Irene Hertwig got a permit for the club that is posted at the clubhouse.

State Surplus priority Status- The state offers early purchase to Non Profit's. CCRP will be checking to see if we qualify.

Rule on Designates annual money making match- There is no rule that will allow a range to keep all the proceeds from a match on the books.

License for trailer- CCRP will license the club trailer for road use.

Cleaner for indoor Range- CCRP missed the cutoff for Friends of the NRA. A cleaner would run \$3,500 up. There will be further discussion on this subject.

A friend of the NRA- There is a new contact for Friends of NRA and it was stated that clubs that donate would get the grants first.

Circle drive at Clubhouse entrance- A motion was made by Larry Lufkin to build a drive in front of the clubhouse for the sole purpose of loading and unloading only. There will be no parking there. 2nd by Ray Crisp all members voted in favor.

Wood cutters needed- There are logs that need cut and stacked for fire wood for CCRP. Please contact Bob Greenman for more info.

Land move for Range expansion- A motion was made by J.K. Johnson 2nd by Bob Greenman to get options and costs for the heavy equipment work so CCRP can move forward. All members voted in favor.

Meeting Adjourned at 9:24 pm Motion by Bob Greenman 2nd by Doug Simpson. All members voted in favor.
