MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

NRA membership (required)

Orientation class (required)

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

We had 12 stages to shoot over the weekend. That sums up to around 20,000 rounds down range. That's not counting the long range event or the cowboy shoot off. Unknown to the shooter, the guns were staged at random in a series of coffins. After 12 fun main match stages, we had a man-on-man shoot off for bragging rights. It took a while, and several cowpokes went to the wire for the title. Our man on top ended up being Diamond Slinger. Congratulations Diamond. He needs no bragging rights. This guy is awesome!

Our long range side match was again planned for Saturday afternoon. We had 34 shooters signed up for the long range, of which most shot 3 guns. In an effort to reduce the lines, we allowed the campers and range hands to shoot on Friday afternoon after setup. It turns out most of the shooters lined up on Friday. In the long range event we had categories and winners as follows:

Wil Sackett came up with a series of cowboy trivia questions that challenged the minds of some of our best cowpokes. That turned out to be a great way to celebrate the birthday of our hero John Wayne. As a side note, Paso Tom and Cedar County Sheriff had to be disqualified because we had to give other cowpokes a chance to participate. They knew all the answers. And, of course, we had a little cowboy poetry. Chucho will never get away without reciting his famous poem about performing mouth-to-mouth resuscitation on a cow!

For those of you who don't know, all SASS shooters have an alias. Sometimes we never learn what people's real names are. We don't know what they do or where they come from. Sometimes you don't even recognize them if you run into them on the street because they don't have their hats and other gear on. At our Saturday night campfire, we took turns explaining to the others how we came up with our alias. Those were some of the most interesting stories I've ever heard. Some were guite funny too!

So, you see, it's not just about shooting. It's about camaraderie, a way of life, and enjoying the common values of people who very rapidly become part of the cowboy family. We all had a great time going back and living, if only for a short time, in the days of the past.
