## August Beginner/Intermediate Match

We thought the August match would be held in the rain but the day turned out to be a really good one. Nineteen signed up for the match and 8 of those brought two guns. If the 19 shooters, 8 were beginners while the rest all shot in the intermediate class.

The match included three 18-shot stages and one walk & shoot stage. The three standing stages included a variety of paper, bowling pins, and steel. On the Texas Star, Ron out-did himself and set up 3 steel plates at the bottom plate of the star. This made it impossible to see the entire star plate and only gave the shooter a couple of inches for a target. Shooters who hit the large plates before all five plates were off the star lost points. On the tree stage, Ron put blocking plates at the bottom of the tree which also gave the shooters a much smaller target. As with the star, shooters who hit the blocking plates before the tree was completed lost points.

The walk and shoot stage featured two barrels and several short stops along the way. Shooters needed to count shots and remember to reload while walking from one target area to the next. At the first barrel shooters had to bend down and shoot two targets through the barrel. After that, shooters had to find and shoot several pins and plates that were hidden in the grass and weeds of the berm. At the last barrel, shooters shot a single long distance target from the prone position. Ron limited shooters to one minute and 30 seconds but most shooters were able to complete the stage in the required time.

Surprisingly, the scores overall were very good, considering the difficulty of the two stages with blocking plates. Petr Baster, Gerold Trusty, and Ida Eardley were the top of the beginner class while Ron Lohman, Tom Eardley, Larry Lufkin, and Gary Baldwin topped the Intermediate shooters. Mikel Sparling made the shot of the day with her short-barreled Khar 9mm by picking off the bottom plate of the star, between two blocking plates, while shooting from a kneeling position.

Our next match will be held Saturday, September 12th. We ask shooters to arrive at 8 AM and help finish setting up the match. Also, Ron continues to need help Friday afternoon when he sets up most of the match. Rick Walker and Larry Michaels helped Ron set up the August match and earned hours toward their club assessment fee. Our goal is to start shooting before 9 AM and finish with the match by 12 or 1 PM.

For new shooters and first time shooters please bring your favorite center fire revolver or semi-auto pistol, at least 100 rounds of ammo, along with a belt and hip holster. You will also need at least three speed loaders or magazines. We know from experience that 380 auto's just don't have enough power to knock down the bigger plates. A 9mm is about as small a caliber you should bring to the match. If you don't have any equipment, come on out anyway and try out a gun or two before you buy one of your own. We have spare equipment available for those just starting out.

### **MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES**

***Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003***

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

**(GUESTS:** Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
