# Beginner/Intermediate Pistol Match January 2011

The Beginner/Intermediate match drew 17 shooters for the January match. It was a bit cold for shooting but the rain held off for the entire match. There were lots of cold fingers at this match. Three shooters brought a second gun and two brought a 3rd gun.

The match was 72 shots with 6 stages. All 6 stages were shot on bay 2 and Ron decided not to set up a walk and shoot this month. Instead, as a make up for previous extra hard matches, all six stages were shot from the 15 yard line and all shooters were allowed as much time as they needed to complete each stage. One difficulty factor for the match was that paper plate sizes that varied from 12 inches down to 4 inches. Also, on stage two, shooters were not allowed to shoot the two 12 inch plates until all of the Texas Star plates were on the ground.

Because this match was so much easier, scores were significantly higher than in several prior matches. Ron Lohman was best in the advanced class with a 71, while Gary Baldwin shot a 67 in the intermediate class. Brian Keay and Frank Bennett tied for best in beginner class with a score of 57.

Mark your schedule for February 12 for the next Beginner Match and we will see you at the Action Pistol Range. Remember, our matches are usually held the second Saturday of each month. Ron announced that the February match will include a 4X4 shoot so bring your big bore guns along in February. Go to the CCRP website at http://ccrpclub.org/members/ and click on "calendars", and then click on "All Calendars" to find the list of monthly event calendars for the Club. Select the month you want to view in order to verify the date of our beginner match that month.

All pistol shooters are invited to the Beginner/Intermediate match and you can really hone your accuracy skills at this match. If you know any beginners who want to learn safety rules and basic shooting skills, send them to our match. Ron has put the first Saturday of each month on the calendar for beginner training at the Action Pistol Range. Shooters who want to attend this training need to show up at a beginner match and sign up for the training. Ron will provide additional comments about each training class when you sign up.

For each match, shooters should bring a hip holster and a center fire pistol – semi or revolver – of 9MM or larger caliber, and at least 3 speed loaders or magazines. Four are better. Cross-draw and shoulder holsters are not allowed. We recommend that you bring at least 100 rounds to the match so that you have plenty of ammo for the match and practice shooting. Any shooters who do not have the needed equipment may borrow equipment from Larry or Ron but we ask that they reimburse us for the ammo they use.

We ask that shooters show up at 8 AM to help set up targets for the match and stay and help tear down the targets after the match has been completed. Matches are usually completed around 1 PM.

## MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually.
