Too bad all shooting for score was off hand!

BO Brown was on hand to assist in scoring and posting scores along with Reliable Tony which made the Match Director's job much more enjoyable. During the Free Trappers meeting BO went over the arrangements and confirmed that everything is on schedule. The selection of leadership for Rain Dee Voo 2012 was completed designating Rowland Zoller as Booshway and Tim Sampson as Segundo.

Under the heading of coming events, reminder to all that the Evergreen Muzzleloaders will have their monthly shoot on Sunday February 13th under Steve Skillman's direction. A reschedule of the APRIL monthly match will be to April 9th to allow attendance by a number at the 1st Horn convention and show in Vancouver,. ## A Tribute to--Noel Vaughn

My friend Noel Vaughn passed away on the 2nd of December at the age of 69. He went in for heart surgery and never came out. We met in 1972 or so, when we and some others founded a muzzle loading club in Olympia. Typical of Noel, he shot well, but one of his pistols was an "in line" built on a .45 frame. Not one for "Little Theatre", he liked things a "little different". From that we graduated to Single Shot shooting where his .22 was a great ugly Martini-actioned thing that he shot very well. From that grew Long Range Blackpowder cartridge, where Noel had a Martini-actioned prone gun for his work at 1000 yards. We shot the British Columbia Sniper matches too, but his enduring passion was pistol shooting. He shot some High Power, both prone and off hand in which

he excelled. Then along came trap shooting. Noel loved to get other people involved – he explained that he liked to spend other peoples' money. He dragged me off to Evergreen Gun Club one Wednesday to shoot with the other old retired guys, which ended up costing me a Ljutic trap gun. I was always a bit behind him in trap. Last year some time, he e-mailed me that he had just shot his first 50 straight. He didn't like to get up early, being a bit of a "night owl." In later years, he didn't shoot at matches he considered outside his driving range. That probably played into the fact that he wasn't interested in hunting other than varmints, specifically Oregon sage rats. Oregon sage rats don't come out until the day warms up a bit. He was part of a group that went to Oregon once or twice a year, beginning sometime in the 'eighties. True to form, he acquired a .19 Calhoun (built on a .22 Hornet cartridge), which was a great rat gun. His last passion and one in which he really excelled was air gun shooting, both from a bench and at field targets. He assisted in running the matches at Olympia and frequently competed at TRRC, in University Place. He was prominently in the winner's circle. I don't know how many air guns he owned; there were many. He used one to shoot Oregon sage rats - I saw him kill one at a laser measured distance of 45 yards. I probably knew him as well as anyone - he was absolutely honest, supportive of the shooting sports and carried more than his share of the load. He took over running the Olympia indoor pistol league, and for a few years alternated running the West-side Indoor Pistol Championship. He ran both of the air gun disciplines and the small bore league at the Evergreen Gun Club in Olympia. Running matches can be a real pain, but he felt that one should give back to the sport. That was how Noel was--He will be missed.

## MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(<u>GUESTS:</u> Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
