Old Soldier Match October 23, 2011

There were 12 shooters who came out to shoot at 200 yards from the prone position. It started out overcast and then the sun came out after all the shooting was over. Temperature started in the 50's and went to the 60's with very little wind. The military type "dog tag" award went to the top three places.

The top three scores were close. Tony Minerd squeaked-by for 1st place with a 291-9x edging out Rod McDonald's 2nd place score of 290-8x and Gary Baldwin's 3rd place score of 289-8x. We had a tie score for fourth place with a score of 287 between James Clark and Gary Thorson. The "x" count broke the tie with James Clark taking 4th with a 287-10x to Gary Thorson's 287-4x for 5th place. X's do count. There were only 8 points between 1st and 7th place. Good shooting guys.

Rod McDonald took a rough road to his 2nd place. He was allowed special dispensation to shoot his M1A in 7.62x51mm for awards [the M1A (semi-auto version of M14) was not an issued military rifle] and Rod was having so much fun in the second string of 15 shots that he shot 20 shots, therefore, his top 5 hits were not allowed.

Larry Schadt shot a Winchester Model 94 in .30-30 for awards. This was allowed. The story goes that in WW1 good quality wood was an essential war item, for airplane construction, and the logging industry on the US west coast (mills, lumber yards etc) was actually guarded by a lot of troops using the .30-30 Model 94.

Harvey Gertson learned that on a rifle used in past Old Soldier Matches if you change the elevation setting during practice at 100 yds, you need to remember what the 200 yd setting was. Harvey shot 15 rounds during the sighting-in period and still didn't have the sight picture he would have liked. He used Kentucky windage to shot the match.

After the match was over there was a special standing shot at two "Foam Heads" sitting on top of the tires at 200 yards. The command to fire was given, shots went down range, they were hitting left, right and over the "Heads" but Fran Huntington came through by hitting both heads. He did it with 2 shots.

After the Old Soldier Match there were 6 shooters for the Carbine match. The course of fire was an "Official 100 Yard Military Type Target" at 100 yards. The target has a 5.5 inch bull and a 1.75 inch V ring (like an X ring). At 100 yards, 20 rounds were shot slow fire (10 minutes) from prone position and 10 shots rapid fire prone (1 minute) then 10 shots rapid fire (1 minute) standing. The highest score out of a possible 200 points wins.

First went to Fran Huntington with a 181-2v using a M1 Carbine. Second went to Ken Horton with a score of 177-5v using an AR-15, M4 Carbine. Gary Thorson was Third with a 163-2v using an M1 Carbine.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
