Shantel Turner posted a 95-1x to win the 8 and under. I believe both grand daughters beat Herb Turner to his delight I might add. January Match Report

One week into the new year the muzzleloading matches resumed. The weather forecast held true with cloudy, dry skies for the event. Following a showery Friday set up with the assistance of Reliable Tony and Kent Dunn, the gray dawn of Saturday saw eight of the "old reliables" come to the Black Powder Range to renew their competition. When the echoes of gunfire died out and the smoke drifted off to join the clouds, luck shoot prizes were gathered in by Tim Sampson for the Turkey Head target and Mike Nesbitt's Poker hand. "Weener" (vienna sausage) prizes went to reward the diligent efforts for low score on each match while the top places "got the beef" choosing from Summer Sausage, jerky or kielbasa. Trade gun "weener" was Doug Simpson with Will Ulry-1st, Adam Sampson-2nd, and Don Kerr-3rd. For this month's match Will found eliminating the rear sight greatly benefited his shooting. But Will was the weener on the Rifle match while Mike Nesbitt took 1st, Adam Sampson-2nd, and Don Kerr-3rd. Don got maximum attire points for the day with his impressive new suit of elk-skin leathers. Pistol results: Kent Dunn took the vienna can with Adam Sampson-1st, Doug Simpson-2nd and Mike Nesbitt-3rd. Aggregate prizes for those choosing to donate to the blanket, went to; Mike Nesbitt-1st, Adam Sampson-2nd, Don Kerr -3rd, Doug Simpson-4th, BO Brown-5th, Will Ulry-6th and Kent Dunn-7th.

The subsequent Free Trappers meeting was brief in the absence of the Booshway, with a reminder of the Range Cleanup scheduled for Saturday, January 28th. Receipt of the WSMA grants was acknowledged along with the questionable status for the April Scout event which may proceed if an alternate troop develops interest. Range reservations have been made for a Summer ML event the first weekend in July with details to be developed between the Free Trappers and the Evergreen Muzzleloaders

At the conclusion of the muzzleloading matches the range was reorganized for a "first-of'-its -kind" event. Under an event-approved exception, the competition continued with early day black powder centerfires. The variety of competitors and firearms was considerable and proceedings on targets at 50 and 100 yards gave a chance for demonstration of shooting skills as well as displaying a considerable variety of smoke-poles. Score ranking and shooting equipment was as follows. Mike Nesbitt was high scorer (181) with his High Wall by C. Sharps Arms in .32-40, Will Ulry-2nd (180x) with a 45-70 Shiloh Sharps, Adam Sampson-3rd (134) using a 45-70 Model 1875 Sharps by C. Sharps Arms. Bob Parr, the sole lever action shooter, used a "76 Winchester "repro" in 45-60 for 4th (126), Irene Hertwig used a Browning '85 High Wall in .45-70 to gain 5th place (95), Kent Dunn took 6th (83) with a Pedersoli Sharps 45-70. In 7th place, Spencer Mallory, a 15 year old Junior shooter used an H&R Handi-rifle in 45-70 (68) and Tim Sampson, 8th place, challenged the course with an original 45-70 Trap Door Springfield Rifle and a .43 Spanish Remington Rolling Block (64). MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of \$10.00 for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.
