# **High Power Rifle Match Introduction**

As we begin a new year of High Power Rifle matches at CCRP, we thought now would be a good time to let you know what's happening. Long time High Power Range Director Rick Baldwin has stepped down from the position. Thank you Rick for all your hard work over the years! We have a team-of-three who have taken over Rick's duties. They are:

Tony Minard – CMP Match Director

Fran Huntington – M1 Garand Match Director

Gary Thorson – Old Soldier Match Director

Our high power rifle matches are intended to be fun matches where shooters can learn the high power rifle game, and improve their skills. The matches generally follow NRA High Power Rifle Match Rules. However, the Match Directors deviate from the NRA rules a little to foster a learning experience for shooters who are new to formal matches. Come on out and give it a try! The *Regulars* are all friendly folks and will take the extra time to help you learn the game. All the high power matches are fired on 200 yard bulls-eye targets. Several of our shooters have gone on to shoot NRA sanctioned across-the-course matches, and earn their NRA classifications. These NRA sanctioned matches are held at Paul Bunyan in Puyallup, Cascade in Ravensdale, and other ranges around the state. The sanctioned across-the-course matches are fired at 200, 300, and 600 yards. Our local CCRP Club high power matches are a great place to learn the game so you will know what to expect when you go to one of the "big matches".

Set up for each match starts at 8:30 AM, and shooting starts at 9:00 AM. Each match has a \$10.00 entry fee. Awards will be given for placing in any of our matches. Here's a synopsis of the three matches:

**The CMP Match** (name taken from the Civilian Marksmanship Program) follows the NRA High Power Rifle match format. We call it CMP because it is geared toward the use of the Service Rifle, such as M1 Garand, M1A, AR-15, etc. Other types of high power rifles, such as Match Rifle and F-Class, can shoot in the match, but only Service Rifle shooters will qualify for match awards. The course of fire is 50 rounds for a total of 500 points, as follows:

20 rounds slow fire prone position, in 20 minutes

10 rounds rapid fire prone position, in 70 seconds

10 rounds rapid fire sitting position, in 60 seconds

10 rounds slow fire standing position, in 10 minutes

The CMP Matches are held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the odd numbered months; Jan, Mar, May, Jul, Sep, Nov. - Following the CMP match we have a .22 rimfire rapid fire silhouette match. Bring your .22!

**The Old Soldier's Match** is another fun match. This match is for Standard Issue Military Rifles. You can use any standard issue military rifle, from any country, in *as-issued* configuration. We see some really interesting rifles show up here, and that's part of the fun. Typically, we see M1 Garand, M1903, M1917 Enfields, British Enfields, Mausers, Mosin Nagants, Swiss K31's, etc. (M1A and AR-15 don't qualify because these are not *standard issue*; the M-14 and M-16 with select fire capability were the standard issue military versions of those rifles). You can come shoot M1A and AR-15 in the match, but you won't qualify for placing in the match. The course of fire is all slow fire from the prone position, with two 15-shot strings in 15 minutes each, for a total of 30 rounds and 300 points. The Old Soldier's Matches are held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of even numbered months; Feb, Apr, Jun, Aug, Oct, and Dec. - Also, following the Old Soldier's Match we have a really fun carbine match.

**M1 Garand Match**: In 2011, Fran Huntington started up a match specifically for M1 Garand rifles. If you have an M1 collecting dust in the back of your safe, get it out, clean it up, and come on out for these fun matches. The club has a couple of M1 loaner rifles; contact Fran if you want to borrow an M1 for the match. The course of fire is the same as the CMP match. These matches are held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of each month from April through September. - And following the M1 match, there will be a fun match for lever action and single shot rifles.

A new program we are starting up this year is the "*CCRP Distinguished Rifleman*" award program. This is not the same as the CMP Distinguished program; we just plagiarized the name. Here's how this will work: If you place in any of the three high power matches you will receive *points*. Between the CMP, Old Soldier, and M1 Garand matches, there will be a total of 18 matches for the year that you can earn *points* in. We will award points based on your placing in the match (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, etc.) and the number of participants in each match. The more participants, the more places will earn *points*. At the end of the year, those shooters who have earned an aggregate of 20 points or more will be awarded the designation of "**CCRP Distinguished Rifleman**" for that year. There will be certificates awarded to each Distinguished Rifleman, and the top finisher for the year will receive a trophy.

Come on out and have some *High Powered* fun.

#### <u>MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES</u> Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues \$70.00 for the first member of each household and \$35.00 for each

additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) \$80.00 for each household and a refundable gate card deposit

fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually

or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of \$80.00.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old <u>as guests</u> as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
