Beginner/Intermediate Action Pistol—June 2012

Great weather for shooting—but likely the beginning of vacation season limited us to 25 shooters for June's Beginner/Intermediate Action Pistol match. Ron Lohman and Dick Smith took top honors in the Advanced classification; Larry Schadt and Gerold Trusty in the Intermediate class, and Tim Bartley and Gene Crosby took the one/two places in the Beginner category. We were pleased to have four new shooters join us. Tom Eardley and Gary Baldwin managed to knock Ron off the pedestal spot in the Single Action competition—finally!

The Walk & Shoot is back for the summer months and contributes a real challenge to putting all of the skills together that we are taught in a tactical setting that is timed and scored heavily on safety and being accurate. This is also an excellent opportunity to get a little adrenalin mixed into your shooting, to rattle your cage just a bit—the stress being a too-often missing component of simply shooting at paper.

I had an interesting discussion with one of the participants. He felt that there was more “action” in some of the other local AP matches. In really reflecting on this, it is quite obvious that Ron is pushing us all to precision shooting, and not the “spray and pray” approach we see in some of the other close up, big target matches—but what about having to intervene in a hostage situation. This month's match was difficult for Intermediate/Advanced shooters who had sufficient weak hand/strong hand exercises to knock average scores down a good bit. And Ron made us use unusual magazine counts to keep us on our toes. The Beginners had it easy, being able to shoot with both hands. The good thing is that we are all advancing in our shooting skills. I like the precision aspect and the Walk-and-Shoot gives it great balance. I feel this is excellent skill development should the need ever come to use a handgun in a defensive mode.

Next month should see the start of the summer weather. So, join us, BUT next month the match will be held on the FIRST Saturday, July 7th, at 8:30AM. Bring a center-fire handgun of 9mm or greater caliber, 100 rounds of ammunition, a holster (one that follows the line of the leg, not canted back for safety; no cross draw or shoulder rigs), eye and hearing protection (but don't despair – if you don't have any of these, we may be able to help you out). Bowling Pin Shoot

CCR&P's Annual Bowling Pin Trophy Pistol Matches are being held on August 19th. Each match consists of 12 tables of six pins. You have 13 seconds for 6 shots at each table. The range is 25 feet. No ported barrels, lasers, or optical sights are permitted. All firing commences from the ready position.

Registration starts at 8 a.m.; firing begins at 9:00 a.m.

Match #1. The .32 caliber purse gun match. Calibers are limited to .32 ACP and .32 S&W Long. Fixed sights and barrels of 4 inches or less are required. Unlike matches 2, 3 and 4, you only have to knock the pins down.

Match #2. Single-action revolvers. Simultaneous extractors are not permitted.

Match #3. Pistol. What used to be the revolvers only match has been expanded to include the self-loading magazine feed varieties.

Match #4. Your Last Chance. Just like #3, revolvers, autoloading, single-action, double action are allowed.

Fees: Ten dollar cover fee and \$5.00 per gun.

Lunch: Burgers, dogs, sodas, water, etc. are covered by your entry fees.

Trophies: Three places will be awarded for each match except match #4 which will be awarded 5 places.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES***Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003***

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)
