Indoor .22 cal Pistol League Starts

Hey Pistol Shooters,

On Monday October 1, 2012 the .22 cal Fall Indoor Bullseye Pistol League will start. The shooting is from 50 feet, one handed with a semi-auto or revolver in .22 cal. LR with open sights or optics, no lasers. The League is on Monday nights and runs eleven weeks with shooters submitting 10 scores to complete the league. Each score consists of firing 60 shots. Twenty shots each in slow fire, timed fire and rapid fire. There are relays at 6:30 and 7:30 p.m. Shooters can submit one or two scores each night.

Shooters can also pay the fee and shoot for fun, one or two handed.

High Power Shooters

We had a great turn out today with 13 shooters for the Old Soldier's Match. Fran brought his friend Jack Morris; WELCOME JACK! And Wounded Warrior Ken Horton was back in action today, and if his score is any indication, he has made a fine recovery. We had some good scores today, with the top 6 places being scores of 273 or above (out of a possible 300).

Fran Huntington and Rod McDonald TIED for 1st place, with each shooting 291-8X! To settle the score, we held a shoot off. The shooters took turns with single round off hand standing shots at the 200 yard gong. Rod missed his first shot, and Fran hit his first shot, making Fran the match winner. **Great shooting, guys!**

Tom Krugman and Ken Horton jumped on the opportunity to rack up some more Distinguished Rifleman points, with Tom earning 6 and Ken earning 5. If these guys keep it up, they'll make Distinguished before the end of the year.

For the Carbine Match, your devious Match Director set up a Team Match. We used 100 yard bullseye targets. We set up two targets at 50 yards, and two targets at 100 yards. Since Rod and Fran tied in the Old Soldier match, we appointed them the Team Captains, and since Fran won the shoot off, he got to pick first. And since we are such a creative bunch, we named the teams the Left Team and the Right Team, and each team would shoot at either the left or right target.

The course of fire was – load two 10 round magazines. At the command to “fire”, shooters would take 5 shots offhand at the 50 yard target, then drop to kneeling and take 5 shots at the 50 yard target. Then go to the prone position, change magazines, and take 10 rounds prone at the 100 yard target. All of this in a *time goal* of 2 minutes. After each 2 minute stage, we would change targets and score. We ran through this three times for a total of 60 rounds for each shooter.

For scoring, we would total up the target scores and divide by the number of shooters on the team – since we had one team with 4 and one team with 5 shooters. The Right Team beat the Left Team by a total score of **464** to **427**.

Season Finale M1 Garand Matches

Yesterday was the 2012 Season Finale of the M1 Garand Matches. We had 7 shooters turn out, and we all had a good time... How can you not have a good time with an M1?

Dennis Coyle is starting to get the hang of this game. He used club loaner rifle CCR&P #2, which just had its zero confirmed. Dennis shoots pretty darn straight with a sighted in rifle. Dennis shot a very respectable 434-3X, and earned 4 distinguished points! If he keeps this up, we're going to take the bench away from him and teach him to shoot from position.

Ken Horton picked up 5 more distinguished points to bring him up to 18. He needs 2 more points to make Distinguished Rifleman. I'll bet he makes it at the next CMP match on Sunday, Sept. 23rd.

Since this was the final M1 Garand Match of the year, season league scores were calculated for those shooters who participated in a minimum of 5 of the 6 matches. The season scores were calculated by adding the shooters 5 top scores. If the shooter participated in all 6 matches, the low score was thrown out. We had 5 shooters complete the season league.

Following the M1 Match, we had 3 shooters hang around for the Lever Action/Single Shot fun match. Rather than set up target stands, we decided to take turns shooting at the gongs. Gary Baldwin and Fran Hunting were shooting Trapdoor Springfield .45-70's. Gary Thorson was cheating with an AR-15 Plastic Mattel Toy. So, Fran and Gary B. shot at the 100 yard gong, while Gary T. shot at the 200 yard gong. We all took turns with 20 rounds, the most hits would win. ... Well, the .45-70 guys immediately broke the 100 yard gong. So now they had to shoot at 200! We were all pretty even, so with 4 rounds remaining, we started trading rifles – 2 shots with the other 2 rifles. Gary Baldwin and Gary Thorson tied with 5 hits each.

MEMBERSHIP DUES RATES

Dues and Renewal policies are effective September 1, 2003

Members will receive a statement 45 days before their membership expires. (Your renewal month is found on your mailing label.) The dues renewal date is the last day of the month in which members' "annual date" falls. Members' gate card will automatically "lock out" on their renewal date if they have not renewed, and their membership will be considered "inactive" for 30-days, during which time they may still pay their dues. After 30-days on "inactive" status the membership will be terminated. Should they wish to rejoin CCR&P past the 30-days "inactive" status, they must reapply as a new member and attend the Orientation class. **Membership fees**, collected at the time of the orientation classes are:

Annual dues **\$70.00** for the first member of each household and **\$35.00** for each additional eligible member of the household.

Initiation fee (one time) **\$80.00** for each household and a refundable gate card deposit fee of **\$10.00** for each member.

In addition, each member is expected to devote 8 hours of volunteer service annually or recruit two new members or pay an assessment of **\$80.00**.

(GUESTS: Members may bring their spouses and children under the age of 18 years old **as guests** as often as they'd like. Non-immediate family member guests are limited to two visits annually. Members **MUST** accompany their guests at all times, including spouses and children, and are responsible for the conduct of their guests.)

Firing Line

Most problems on the range are resolved with a mutual consideration for our fellow shooters. This is great. We are supposed to be having fun doing our favorite pastime. There does seem to be an alternate way of interpreting the firing line on the high power Range. The firing line is the edge of the concrete. The red line is the safety line used to clear the firing line. When everyone is back of the red line and guns are racked, the command for target replacement or repair can be done. Apparently some believe the red line is the firing line. NO! Firing back within the shed on any range increases the noise level. When others properly firing are on the line these shooters are behind them. This is a safety issue. Muzzles need to be an equal distance from the front of the sheds. The firing line is the edge of the concrete. When those who wish to be back in the shed please at least do it when no one else is there. Another issue arrives when firing within the shed. The posts on the side bay are metal. Bullet impacts here are damaging. Let's be safe out there and have fun. We have some great people out in the club. Let's have some mutual fun.
